- 1. Call to Order and Territorial Acknowledgment Tara Lyons
- **2. Review and Approval of Agenda –** Motion was made by Tracey S to approve the agenda. Seconded by Jen D. Agenda approved
- **3. Review and Approval of Minutes** Motion was made by Jen S to accept and approve the minutes from our last PAC meeting of Thursday April 8, 2021. Seconded by Jen D, no opposition. Minutes Approved
- **3. Principal's Report** April in Review: Jersey and team wear day, Earth day; Earth day events were left to each class
- Bell schedule for next year submitted, three scenarios 1/ covid, 2/ non covid, 3/ staggered start
- 9-2:40 bell times meets ministry standard with 1470 minutes. 2 X 25 min lunch and 2 X 15 min recess.
- 2 X 25 min lunch puts 200 kids outside at a time instead of 400, gives more access to play areas during social distancing

Kindy – grade 2 and grade 3 – grade 5

Teachers reviewed, liked and approved this schedule, its an early dismissal with a 15 min working lunch that counts as instructional time. Benefits are that teachers are in class while kids eat

- 18 divisions next year, same as this year. Slight decrease in staffing, there are less international Ed students
- School exposures: 2 recent exposures. Kudos to the school board for support during this time Isolation letters sent out, 1 class and 7 staff are currently affected

This is very difficult for parents to navigate, info from Fraser Health can be confusing

The isolated group has siblings in other classes, its hard as a parent to know what to do. FHA directs that siblings can go to school if the isolated student does not develop symptoms. If symptoms develop, everyone stays home.

PAC offers admin support if needed at this time

Queston about substitute teachers – is there a diff procedure for a visiting adult. No, adults will wear masks, K-3 students do not have to

- Stella went to the gamin grant presentation put on by the district in April, lots of notes were sent out to confirm inclusion and exclusions in the gaming grant \$.

Can we use gaming \$ for this years O/S expenses? It has to be for extracurricular purposes. We cant change what we have budgeted already, we cant over fundraise for future needs. Gamin funds are also a precedent, what we offer this year, we have to offer next year, ect
