Adjusted Bank balances: Gaming \$11,448.65 General \$23,798.25

- We issued some checks for presenters
- Reminder of hardship fund available for students in need
  - Grade 5 event may need some assistance
- Mrs Kyle has brought up the issue of food security in our student population, its only going to get worse. We could use some hardship funds to buy some snack packs, bars ect to have on hand at the school to be used at admin / teacher discretion
