Ministry Health Protocol Update – our school did not loosen too many measures through 2021, so there are only some minor changes to the plan at ER. Changes include:

- Zones outside for class time
- Classrooms rearranged to support distancing measures
- Mask exemption requests are not as easy to obtain. Must have a medical reason or special need to have an exemption granted. We have approx. 15

Types of Closures the school could be and are prepared to experience:

- 1. Functional: Not enough staff to supervise students
- 2. Health Closure, based on attendance and following ministry guidance
- 3. Transportation Closure (NA for our school)

We follow the BCCDC

There is lots of constantly changing information published, we are hoping to provide some written guidance to parents soon. The biggest issue we have and need to clarify for the school community is, when can kids return? After being confirmed as Covid + and / or being a close contact to someone who has tested positive

Cases are now self managed. The school administration is not allowed to share information on cases in classrooms.

- Parent asks if we are allowed to set up class lists for notification. This is fine but parents must have the option to opt in or opt out
- We currently have an approximate number of 80/90 absent

A parent notes concern about the teacher workload if having to give extra work for kids who are off when in class learning is still being done. The official direction is that teachers are not obligated to provide works for kids at home due to short term illness – this would be up to teachers to do so on an individual basis but it ins not mandatory. Schools are obligated by the school act only to provide work for long term absence

? How is the school admin handling finding substitutes, has it been difficult? Mr H reports that have been lucky, with only Thursdays being an issue so far. We have been short 7 on a day but had 6 TOCs. Often the support teachers, who don't teach full time classrooms, pitch in Ie – Mrs Wang, Mr Drake

? Re: Upcoming Event

- Mar/April has an Indigenous art visitor/ event noted, is it budgeted? Mr H notes that staff from the Indigenous learning department will come to lead students in crafts that are for the our visitation to the welcome posts. Each child will do 2 pieces, 1 for them and 1 will be the gift. We will be asking parents to contribute for this, its not a PAC initiative
- ** PAC wishes to remind everyone that there is a hardship fund to allow for all students to participate in field trips that may have a cost. This is confidentially organized though school admin

Scholastic Book fair: The contact at Scholastic motes that they have safety protocols if we want to have the fair in person but the school has to provide the volunteers and make the decision for the school. We can postpone until April if we prefer to have the fair in person but are not yet ready.

- On line takes away from the experience for the kids and also hinders the parents from adding to each order for the schools interest
- It is possible that school will allow it but PAC provides the volunteers, more discussion to follow
 - It has been decided after the meeting to postpone until the Spring

Face Masks – is the district still providing masks for the school, students and parents? Yes - Mr H reports we have lots of masks, approx.. 1500 kids masks and approx. 300/400 teacher masks although many staff and students are coming with their own.

- Some teachers have noted they would prefer N95 masks. Could the PAC fundraise for this? Yes – need to source
