Upcoming Events:

There are lots of events scheduled and teachers may also start to plan individual classroom events

- Planetarium visit Apr 4/5

- House Post visit walking field trip next week (45 min ½ talk with Tasha, ½ archaeological site visit with Dave)

- Turtle Island Art Start Program: collection of presenters ranging from dancers to puppeteers and signers, performance based (not the same as the Hoop Dancer event)

- Class Photos May 11: we can do traditional bench seating or outdoor on the playground

- Peoples Pantry Presentation

- Indigenous Artist: 2 crafts for students

- Swimming Pool booked: supposed to be grade 1-5 but grade one participation will depend on supervision

- Indigenous Hoop dancer – flexible with dates

- Scholastic Book Fair: Apr 25-29, will get delivery to the gym on Thurs Apr 21. It would be good to have teachers do their walk through Apr 22 so they can make classroom wish lists and parents can add to orders. Pick up will be Mon May 2. Parents will enter after school though the gym doors/ entrance by the Crunch: **no school access for parents**

\*\* PAC wishes to remind everyone that there is a hardship fund to allow for all students to participate in field trips that may have a cost. This is confidentially organized though school admin

## Facility / Grounds Update:

- Paving done by N/W doors

Parents would like to revisit having Saleema Noon for more sessions offered in the classroom, but the teachers have agreed that they are not in favor of this. Discussion is had regarding the nature of the opposition and also how many teachers made this decision for the whole group.

PAC is wondering why this school's opinion of this presentation is so different than other SD43 schools. Mr Hutchison reports that the 3 teachers (spread of grades) who volunteered to review content and make the decision thought that the content was not accurately reflective of the curriculum.

Is there an option for the PAC to bring this forward if they are still unsatisfied with the decision. Ultimately, it is the schools decision to approve what presentations are brough to the school but the Zone Superintendent can be contacted
