Action Plan for Learning (APL) will focus on intellectual development

- 1. Numeracy
- 2. Social and emotional learning
- 3. Indigenous learning / ways of learning
  - a. Inclusions: orange shirt day, hoop dancers, awakening of the drum, resident artist programs

### Sept in Review:

- start of fixed classrooms, Sept 13. We had a student population shift with lots of entries and exits

- 18 divisions
- parent on line forms ready for completion

- focus on learning health and safety protocols, some differences from last year including: no cohorts, can share teachers, up to 50 ppl in the gym, no separate zones for outdoor play, 1 cleaning per day (used to be 2), students can share toys and manipulatives when using good hand hygiene.

- Extra curriculars are slowing returning with caution
- food programs are allowed back, with limits to adults in school

- whole schools can close or specific classrooms can be shut
- school exposure notices are going to be changing

Health and safety protocol similarities include: Staggered arrival/ dismissal, hallway direction control, max 3 in washroom at a time, daily health checks, hand hygiene routines

Parent Question? Do teachers have the authority to send home students who are ill? Teachers would send student to the office, to determine if the students parents are to be contacted to go home

<u>Parent Communication</u> – will continue with weekly "what's new on the ridge" Teachers will use email, teams and online platforms to communicate with class parents

- meet the teacher event next week will be held virtually. No one is invited to the school at this time, but parents can request personal meetings as required. Teachers are preparing materials for parent viewing, such as video and recorded messages

### <u>Tech Update – Mr Botero</u>

We replaced a large amount of tech last year: 26 laptops and 48 IPads, plus 4 TVs and accessories

- 48 IPads is a lot, we anticipated 10 but based on specs and operating systems, we had to replace more

- hopefully we will see need for replacement this year, but its hard to say this early on

- District decides when its time to return/ replace a device

- good news is that devices go to those in need for the "bring your own device program" for upper grades and we get a trade in credit

- PAC funds half of tech purchases

<u>FSA – Foundation Skills Assessment</u> for grade 4s will take place Oct 4-12; letter sent out to parents
