

Eagle Ridge Parent Advisory Council (PAC) Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order and Territorial Acknowledgment – Tara Lyons

4. Principal's Report & Questions - Don Hutchinson

- 1. APL is getting ready for spring assessment.
- March in Review: New afterschool programs soccer is full, Place des Arts have 12 kids. Six Cedars assemblies, lots of field trips and class presentation, family movie night, green theme day.

- 4. Grade 3 gifted screening will begin next week. Assessment gives insight into learning challenges kids might have

Summary of discussion after Principal's report:

Krista Davy – Connect to Kindergarten sessions will be hosted in school. Planning 3 different afternoons of 45 minute blocks. 1st day having students come into Davy and Howards classrooms, 2nd session in Kroeker's classroom. On the 3rd day, kids will be with teachers, and parents with Don.

Tara, are you interested in doing blurb from PAC? Tara says yes. Dates will be May 12, 19, 26. [PAC commitment is for May 26th 1:45-2:30.]

Tara L. – (Regarding the upcoming Como Lake relays) 55 kids are going. Are parents driving them and picking up?

Don H. – Yes.

Tara L. – What is track attack?

Don H. – Grades 3, 4, 5s are spending 6 afternoons outside, rotating 8 stations. Team is made after assessment. This group and then goes to district track meet at SFU.

Torill G. – (Regarding Eagle Ridge's proposed bell schedule) Admin procedure 131 states that schedules should be consulted with staff and parents and meet the requirement of minimum instructional time. When and how will parents be consulted? How will parents feedback be used?

Don H. – Next year schedules haven't been submitted yet. After then, schedule will be presented. Share concerns with district superintendant Gerald Chong to confirm. District needs to confirm schedule. Will be meeting with Nadine Tomouline (sp?), she was fine with schedule but the schedule still hasn't been sent for final sign off.

Torill – will minimum hours be met for this year?

Don – talk to Gerald. Most schools following 293 or 294 minutes per day.

Joanne B. – Eating time is being used for instructional time. What is going on in the classroom during this period?

Don H. - Reading to kids, teachers should not be eating lunch and watching cartoons.

Krista D.– Children are eating and I move around and work with specific children.

Tanya Peresin– (audio problems)

Joanne B. – Other schools also have a working lunch but haven't reduced the school day. Is there anything that can be done so that the school day isn't shortened?

Don H. – Those schools have extended lunch hour but noon hour supervisors are only here for an hour so we can't extend lunch hour. Problems occur if kids are out for more than 30 minutes. We might switch so that primaries have lunch outside first.

Tara L. – Can we add discussion of the schedule to next meeting?

Don H. – Yes. In previous years some schools weren't meeting the instructional time requirement. District will fine tooth comb the schedules.

Tanya P. – Working lunch is used for instruction because we need that time to meet the curriculum.

Torill G. – Some consideration to families and their schedules is warranted.

5. Executive Committee Reports

President's report – Tara Lyons

- Movie night
 - Held on March 31 had to order more pizzas.
 - Will order pizzas to sell slices next time.
- Spirit of Coquitlam grant update
 - Torill G. put in grant with Tracey S. and Tara L.
 - City wants to work with us, but it looks like they won't fund the pancake breakfast because we did it last year. They would help purchase the equipment, but the issue with that is space. We could purchase plates, spatulas, etc.
 - Perhaps the dance would fit the criteria better? The city needs new proposal by Monday.

Jen S. – Can we tweak pancake breakfast so that it's new?

Torill G., Jen S., and Tara L. will discuss further. Community welcome in September is another option.

21 teachers have submitted reimbursements so far. Don has reminded teachers. Some cheques haven't cleared yet. Becky has some concerns about some of the items purchased and she will discuss with exec later.

- Focus now is on getting year end dance ready. Event will be evening of June 20th. Have hired entertainer. What do parents want at this event? Game stations? Do we need event insurance?
 - Alesia S. what about a photo booth?
 - Don H. says insurance should be covered under school but will check.
- Will put together plan and will motion about it at May meeting.
- Are we allowed bouncy castles?
 - Don H. Check whether the businesses that rent them carry liability insurance.

- b. Traffic Safety Committee

- c. Grade 5 Committee Tara L. (no committee rep present)
 - Note PAC hasn't been kept sufficiently in the loop about this committee's plans and activities
 - Thursday June 15 Pizza lunch will be served by parent volunteers.
 - School rate is available for Fresh Slice and Domino's, but we don't know who they are using
 - Kona ice slushy truck will visit school and serve grade 5s. A gift card will be given to each child but we haven't been told what's going in there.
 - \$750 from gaming was allocated by PAC to grade 5 committee.
 - Parents are paying for part of Cultus trip and the school paying the rest. Grade 5 committee won't have to pay for this.
 - We need to consider that this needs to be equitable between years.
- d. Childcare Committee
 - Ministry announced soft start for a before and after school care for kindergarten were in school before and after school. But our district is not currently entertaining it.

 - Apr. 4th event held
 - Dr Williams. 18 in attendance. Good discussion but less interactive than previous year.
 - Consider PAC night on substance use or harm reduction.
