





#### THE SEMESTER SYSTEM

All students take a minimum of:

- Eight (8) courses in a school year
- Four (4) courses each semester

#### Semester 1

goes from September to January

#### **Semester 2**

goes from February to June

Note: a typical student schedule goes from Block 1 – Block 4.

Blocks X and Y are "outside the timetable" and allow students to take specific extra classes before or after school (e.g. choir).

These optional **X** and **Y** selections are <u>in addition</u> to your eight required courses.

# 1-to-1

Gleneagle is a 1-to-1 school and all students need access to a device that meets the criteria outlined below. This could be a laptop, a tablet with an attached keyboard, or a netbook (Chromebooks are a popular choice, as long as they are capable of running Office 365). Note that a smartphone is not a suitable device.

#### Minimum device requirements

- ✓ Minimum 10" screen
- ✓ Minimum 8-hr battery life
- ✓ Physical keyboard
- ✓ Wi-Fi access
- ✓ Current operating system (iOS 10.12+ or Microsoft 10)

- √ 16Gb internal storage
- ✓ Camera/Webcam



# English as an Additional Language (EAL)

After ELD 11, the student is ready to take an English 10 course. This is followed by English 11 and English 12, as well as a Social Studies 11 or 12 course to meet graduation requirements.

## **Physical and Health Education 9**

\*If you choose Band 9 as an elective, your PHE class will happen every second day all year, and alternate with your Band class

\*If you are not in Band 9, your PHE class will happen every day for one semester



#### **Career Education 9**

This course does <u>not</u> take up a block in your timetable. The curriculum is delivered through your core academic classes. It covers topics of Personal Development, Connections to the Community, and Life and Career Plan.

# Languages

Gleneagle currently offers **two** languages up to the Grade 12 level. The courses shown here are appropriate for beginners with no previous experience (French 9 can be taken by complete beginners or those who have taken French 8).

You do not need a second language to graduate but **some** universities **may** require a language course for certain programs. SFU and UBC are currently removing their language 11 requirement for admission to most programs (SFU now, UBC in Sept 2026), but always check websites for confirmation.

If you already speak one of the languages offered, you may <u>not</u> take the Grade 9 course. Once you are in Grade 9, speak to the language teacher to be placed in the correct level for your Grade 10 year.

If you are fluent (oral <u>and</u> written) in a second language already, you can take the <u>language</u> challenge exam when you are in Grade 11 (only available for certain languages).

## Languages

If you do not take a language in Grade 9, you can pursue a language credit later by starting **French 9** when you are in Grade 10, or you may take **Intro Spanish 11** in Grade 10 or beyond. Intro 11 courses are fast-paced, condensed classes covering the main elements of both the 9 and 10 courses.

# Languages

#### Mandarin Bilingual Program:

Students in the MB program take the following courses in high school:

Grade 9: Mandarin 11 MB

Grade 10: Mandarin 12 MB and Career Life Education 10 MB

Grade 11: Asian Studies 12 MB

Grade 12: Work Experience 12 MB

Please note that if you are in this Program of Choice, you are not eligible to apply for other Programs of Choice, such as TALONS or COAST, as their schedules run concurrently.

\*Choir, Jazz Band, and Vocal Jazz take place outside the timetable. They do not count towards your required courses, so you still need to choose 3 other electives.

†Vocal Jazz and Jazz Band additional electives that require an audition and have limited space. Students wanting to join Vocal Jazz must <u>also</u> register in Choir 9. Students wanting to join Jazz Band must <u>also</u> register for Band 9. Email <u>etrovato@sd43.bc.ca</u> to arrange an audition.

#### **Fitness & Conditioning 11: Aerobics**

Designed to encourage both active and non-active teen girls to participate in a variety of fun-filled fitness and recreational activities. Try out Pilates, weight training, aerobics, hiking, yoga and more! Open to all grades, within the timetable as one of your three electives (you must still take PHE 9).

# Elective Courses Physical & Health Education

#### Fitness & Conditioning 11: Basketball

\*An additional elective that takes place at 7:30 am **before school, 2-3 times a week all year**, for Grades 9-12 students, whether novice or experienced athletes. Improve fitness and skills specific to basketball, participate in sport-specific training, and develop leadership through classroom activities (you must still take PHE 9).



#### **Drafting 9**

Introduction to technical drawing with sketching, modelling, 2D and 3D drafting, computer animation, CADD, computer graphics and more

#### **Technology Explorations 9**

Explore all aspects of the shop, from tools and machinery to 3D printers and welding. Sample it all and then dive deeper into areas of interest, whether fixing things, crafting with wood or applying the principles of mechanical engineering.

#### **Woodwork 9**

Sketch, plan and produce cutting lists; progress from puzzles, toys and tableware to a perfect bookshelf, storage container or special project of your own



## MyEd BC!


1. Course selection is done online through the student's MyEd account (if you do not have access to MyEd, you will fill out a paper course selection form, found on our website under Quick Links 



2. We will automatically assign Grade 9 students to their 5 required courses (or EAL courses or Learning Centre if required).

2. Each student will choose three electives and three alternate (back-up) elective choices.

## **COURSE SELECTION PROCESS**

The **Grade 9 course selection portal in MyEd** will be open **March 12th - 30th.**Grade 8 students will choose 3 electives and 3 alternate choices. Refer to our school website under Quick Links -> Course Planning & Info Videos for documents listed below.

- 1. Follow the detailed instructions in the **Visual Guide** posted on the website, also in Slide 44.
- 2. Read descriptions of courses in the **Grade 9 Electives Booklet.** Check out the **videos** as well!
- 3. When choosing electives, choose something **YOU** want to take.
- 4. Be sure to add your **priority rankings** (1st, 2nd, 3rd) for your 3 electives and your 3 alternates.
- 5. If you change your mind, you can go back in and make changes until Sunday, March 30th.
- 6. You can see the full **Course Planning Booklet** for all grades in the same place on the website.

**Grade 8 Walkabout Tour** for students who live in -catchment. Scott Ck and Summit will bring students here. In-catchment students who attend elsewhere arrange own transportation.

Cross-catchment decisions will be emailed to families.

March 10

Successful cross-catchment applicants will receive a **welcome email** from Gleneagle with instructions for choosing courses in MyEd or via course selection form on paper. The paper form will be posted on our website on March 12<sup>th</sup>, for those who do not have MyEd access.

March 11-12

Gleneagle counsellors will visit students at **Scott Ck**, **Summit and Moody** to start them on the course selection process in MyEd. Students who attend elsewhere will choose electives through MyEd or via paper form if necessary (form will be posted on our website March 12<sup>th</sup>).

March 30

## A Quick Visual Guide



Go to MyEd from Chrome, Firefox, or Edge on a <u>PC</u> (not phone) and login with your 7 digit pupil number (not e-mail address or PEN).




Be sure to select and rank 3

## Choose & rank electives and alternate electives with these steps!



- 9. When completing both the electives section and the alternate electives section, you must <u>rank your requests</u>. There are 2 important things to note:
  - A) Choose a course by clicking the box on the left so that you see a blue check mark.
  - B) Rank your choice by typing the number (1, 2, 3, 4) in the **'Priority'** column on the right side of the page to indicate your first choice, second choice, etc.



\*\*You might not see all the courses on each page at once, depending on the size of your screen.


10. In the electives section and the alternate electives section, you will only see one page at a time.

- A) You will need to click  $\underline{\text{through the pages}}$  using the > and < arrows.
- Bi) To check that you are seeing all the courses listed on any page, you must <u>first go to the horizontal</u> slider bar and slide over to the right.

B ii) This will reveal the vertical slider bar so that you can slide down to see the last few electives in the list.

## THE FINAL STEP!

10. When you are finished with all your course requests, you MUST click the 'Post' button at the bottom of the page.



#### Note:

- 1. Be sure you have chosen and ranked 3 electives, and 3 alternates.
- 2. The section called "Additional Electives" is optional and you only fill this out if you wish to take an extra elective either before or after school.
