#### **ABOUT MDS**

#### **ABOUT TOM FINNIE**

This bursary is in memory of Tom Finnie, who was a former board member of M'akola. Tom was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather. His life was one of total service to his country via the Navy. Every community he lived in was enriched by his presence; each life he touched made better because he cared and let them know they were special.

He was a tireless worker in many organizations throughout his life, including being a trades person. He supported all sports and was a senior game swimmer. He taught cultural activities with School District 71. He travelled as far as Manitoba, teaching drum making, hunting, fishing, and survival.

In recognition of Tom's commitment to his community and the communities served by the M'akola, the organization established an annual Tom Finnie Indigenous Trades Bursary.

#### **BRITISH COLUMBIA REGIONS**

**Six bursaries** of will be awarded over **six regions** to Indigenous students enrolled in a trades program. Each bursary will be in the amount of **\$2,500**.



## WHO IS ELIGIBLE

- Students Indigenous to Canada living in British Columbia
- Applicants of any age
- New or continuing students accepted into a trades program

Demonstrated financial need, as well as life experiences, challenges, and triumphs will be taken into consideration.

#### **BURSARY DETAILS**

- What qualifies as a Trade? A skilled trade is a career path or occupation requiring hands-on work with specialty knowledge. Each skilled trade has a process for getting a certified.
- Does enrollment in a Trades/Dual Credit Program qualify students for the M'akola Bursary? Yes, students who are enrolled in a Trades/Dual Credit program do qualify and should apply!
- If it is a Multi-Year/Term Program can students apply for the future Year/Term? Or if they have already enrolled, could they retroactively apply for the M'akola Bursary? The program is intended for future use only and can be applied towards a new enrollment or the next year of a multi-year course.
- If a student is successful in securing a M'akola Bursary from us, and are in a multi-year program, can they reapply for each year? Winners of M'akola Bursaries may only apply once.
- If a student was unsuccessful in securing a M'akola Bursary, can they reapply? Yes, all students who have yet to obtain a M'akola Bursary are encouraged to apply again.
