The Faculty of Mathematics offers a number of scholarships for incoming first-year students to help offset the cost of university and support you on the important investment into your future. Scholarships are typically **awarded based on grades**, but **some require additional information**, an **application**, and certain applicant criteria to be met. You can be awarded these scholarships in addition to other <u>scholarships awarded by the University of Waterloo</u>. You are encouraged to apply to all scholarships that you meet the eligibility requirements of. For example, if you are an Indigenous Canadian, you would be eligible for Indigenous scholarships as well as National scholarships.

Capilano Excellence Scholarships (CAPX) are the premier entrance scholarships at Capilano University. Up to 10 of these scholarships are offered each year and are awarded to both **domestic** and **international** high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in academics and shown leadership in their school and community. CapU's entrance awards are given to new students to recognize and support achievement in academics, sports, and the arts. Some awards also look at financial need, and many awards are given for your commitment to community involvement and leadership. When you apply to CapU, you can also apply for entrance awards by completing one general online application.
