

The Faculty of Mathematics offers a number of scholarships for incoming first-year students to help offset the cost of university and support you on the important investment into your future. Scholarships are typically **awarded based on grades**, but **some require additional information**, an **application**, and certain applicant criteria to be met. For example, if you are an Indigenous Canadian, you would be eligible for Indigenous scholarships as well as National scholarships.
