2024 BCGEU SCHOLARSHIPS

Value: \$85,000 in total [\$2,000 for full-time students and \$1,000 for part-time students]

Deadline: February 15, 2024

Eligibility: Applicant must be a member of BCGEU in good standing, immediate relative of current, retired or deceased BCGEU member and staff. Eligible relatives include spouses, parents, children or grandchildren (including foster, adopted, stepchildren and stepgrandchildren).

This year, applicants are asked to submit an essay, video, song or infographic in response to one of three questions:

UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO - FACULTY OF MATHEMATICS SCHOLARSHIPS

Deadline: February 16, 2024

Value: Multiple - \$12,000 to \$25,000

The Faculty of Mathematics offers a number of scholarships for incoming first-year students to help offset the cost of university and support you on the important investment into your future. These scholarships can be a **one-time** payment or a **renewable** award that is paid out over multiple terms with specific requirements to remain eligible.

Scholarships are typically **awarded based on grades**, but **some require additional information, an application, and certain applicant criteria** to be met. You can be awarded these scholarships in addition to other [scholarships awarded by the University of Waterloo](#). You are encouraged to apply to all scholarships that you meet the eligibility requirements of. For example, if you are an Indigenous Canadian, you would be eligible for Indigenous scholarships as well as National scholarships.

CAPILANO UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE AWARDS (CAPX) AND OTHER AWARDS

Deadline: March 1, 2024

Value: 10 x up to \$56,000 each (CAPX);

35 x up to \$2,500 each [Capilano Community Leadership Award (CCLA) and others]

Capilano Excellence Scholarships (CAPX) are the premier entrance scholarships at Capilano University. Up to 10 of these scholarships are offered each year and are awarded to both **domestic** and **international** high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in academics and shown leadership in their school and community. CapU's entrance awards are given to new students to recognize and support achievement in academics, sports, and the arts. Some awards also look at financial need, and many awards are given for your commitment to community involvement and leadership. When you apply to CapU, you can also apply for entrance awards by completing one general online application.

HORATIO ALGER SCHOLARSHIP FOR GRADE 11 STUDENTS

VALUE: 160 \$5,000 Scholarships Awarded
