Planned Actions:



Area of focus:

Students will develop their understanding of an Indigenous sense of place, developing their cultural knowledge, and stewardship of the land

Planned Actions:

Planned actions include a continuation of last years activities. Students will explore and learn about the land around our school, use of our outdoor wagon resources, and continued invitation from our district's Indigenous teachers to learn about Indigenous plants and uses. Students will continue to build their cultural knowledge including circle talks, Indigenous curriculum and accessing supports through Indigenous Education.

Indicators of Success:

Ongoing curricular connections to indigenous culture and perspectives through story and language, increased student knowledge of the land around our school, and students will be able to identify ways to care for the land.
