 - c. Discussion around PAC vs. Playground hot lunches (communication/contact)
 - i. discussion around ensuring collaboration and communication between Playground Committee and PAC/Hot Lunch Coordinator to ensure processes are streamlined, information sent to the community is accurate and Playground Fundraiser responsibilities aren't being placed onto other parent volunteer roles
