Greetings Parents/Guardians:

I can't believe how quickly the month of January passed us by. Perhaps it is because we left for Winter Break so late and returned in January later than in the past. February will be a busy month with a lot of short weeks (school closure, Family Day statutory and a Pro-D). All of the remaining dates prior to Spring Break are posted below.

Sometimes when we have an increase in school days off, parents have questions about how these days come about. With reference to professional development days, there are six in a year. One is Provincial, three are district based and two are school based. The history on how teachers negotiated these days goes back to 1972 when professional development days were added to the calendar. The inclusion of these days increased the number of days teachers work, with no loss of instructional days for students. This past year, the Ministry of Education added a day in November so that teachers could work on their understanding of the new curriculum (we had two days in the 2016/2017 school year, and we will not have this day next year).

In addition to the Statutory Holiday (BC Family Day) you noticed that on Friday, February 9<sup>th</sup> there was a school closure day. When the district builds the calendar, it is based on a consistent 180 instructional days. Depending on the year and where Spring Break falls, there may be one, two or no extra closure days. This year there have been two days: one in November and one in February.

Finally, you will notice that we have an early dismissal this coming Thursday, February 15<sup>th</sup> for parent/teacher interviews. I encourage you to take some time to meet with teachers so you are aware of how you can work with your child and teacher to achieve learning goals prior to the second formal reporting period. Formal Reports will go home on Thursday, March 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Anti-Bullying Pink Shirt Day



February 28th is recognized as Pink Shirt Day in honour of two students from a high school in Nova Scotia who witnessed a grade nine boy being picked on by bullies for wearing a pink shirt. The two witnesses, grade

12 boys, decided to take a stand by purchasing 50 pink shirts at a discount store

and emailing classmates to assist them in supporting the bullied student the following day by wearing pink. The act garnered a flood of support for the grade 9 boy and squashed the negative tactics of the two bullies. Not only that, but it sparked a national campaign to end bullying. On February 28<sup>th</sup>, wear pink to support the antibullying movement.
