School Cash Online

School District #43 offers a safe and convenient way for parents to pay for things and complete required school forms. (You also use this method to give your child permission for activities). You will have access to this online program **after your child starts school in September**. You will receive an email from our school office, when this option is available.

If you do not already have a School Cash Online account, then simply type https://sd43.schoolcashonline.com and click on "Get Started Today". You will need to create an online account to pay for things or approve activities. When you create an account, make sure to **OPT IN** to receive email notifications for new items.

School Supplies

Individual school supplies can be sent to school with your child on Monday, September 8th. Information about school supplies was sent to families at the end of the summer and can also be accessed at the following link: <u>School Supplies - Hazel Trembath Elementary School</u> If you ordered a supply kit to be delivered to the school, they will be sent home with students next week so you can label everything and bring the supplies back on Monday September 8th.

<u>Kindergarten Gradual Entry Schedule</u>

Kindergarten parents please be reminded that all kindergarten students are on a gradual entry program for school for the first two weeks (Sept. 2-12). This schedule has been forwarded to individual parents as a reminder of the schedule specific to their child. The kindergarten gradual entry schedule also contains the separate bus schedule for kindergarten gradual entry.

Student Absences / Early Dismissal

If your child is going to be away from school or will be leaving early, please access our school website www.sd43.bc.ca/school/hazeltrembath and create an absence report; or you can email hazeltrembath@sd43.bc.ca; or you can telephone 604-941-0517. It would be helpful to do one of these 3 options by 8:15 a.m. that day. If you are emailing your child's teacher about absences or early dismissals, please be sure to copy the office (hazeltrembath@sd43.bc.ca). **Please do not send your child to school if they are sick.**

Students Arriving Early

Students arriving before 9:00 am should wait with their parent in the area by the office for the buses to arrive. Students should not be going to their classroom until the buses arrive.

Students Not Taking The Bus Home

If your child is not going to be taking the bus home because you are picking them up at the school, please submit an absence report, email or call the school before 1:00 pm that day. This allows us to make sure your child does not go on the bus in error. You will also need to come to the office at the end of the day to sign them out. Students who do not take the bus because they live near our Winslow location do not need to sign out at the end of the day.

MyEd Parent Portal

Information will be sent to all parents again in late September so that you can set up your parent portal in plenty of time for term 1 learning updates in mid December.

Lunch expectations/water bottles

Students are expected to bring a snack and lunch to school with them daily. We strongly encourage students to bring a labelled, refillable water bottle to school daily to help stay hydrated. During eating time, students are expected to be at their desks. Students will be going outside to play at lunch hour rain or shine, with the exception of extreme weather conditions, so please send proper coats, jackets and footwear to school with your child.

Nut Allergies

We do have a few students with severe nut allergies in our school, so we respectfully request that parents do not send nut products to school with their child. Thank you for helping to keep our students safe.

Bus Expectations

Please follow the traffic rules and regulations when dropping off and picking up your child from the bus each day. Ample parent parking is available in the gravel lots by Settler's Park.

Emergency Release Forms / Student Verification Forms

These forms will be distributed in September. You will receive an email from the office when these are available.

Parent Access to the school

Parents, when visiting the school to meet with a staff member or when volunteering in a classroom or field trip we request that you enter our school through the front door on Winslow Avenue and to please sign in at the office. When dropping your child off at Winslow, we ask that you do so at the office and not take them to their classroom. When picking them up, please wait by the office for your child. Thank you for your cooperation.

Welcome back to a new school year at Hazel Trembath Elementary! We would like to extend a warm welcome to all new families joining our community and a heartfelt welcome back to those returning. We want to thank last year's PAC executive for their dedication and hard work in supporting our students, staff, and families through another year of uncertainty. Once again, we find ourselves in a state of limbo as we await more information this fall regarding the rebuild of our school after the fire. Despite this, we are fortunate to have a fabulous PAC Executive in place this year, and we encourage all families to join us at PAC meetings to stay connected, share their voices, and help strengthen our school community.

What is a PAC?

In SD43, a PAC, or Parent Advisory Council, is the official collective voice of parents within a school, providing input and support to the principal and school staff on matters related to the school and student education. PACs serve as forums for parents to discuss school-related issues, volunteer, educate themselves on school activities, and raise funds for enhanced educational opportunities. All parents and guardians of students at a school are automatically members of that school's PAC. At Hazel Trembath, our PAC has been significantly involved in advocacy for the rebuild of the school with media interviews, email campaigns to government ministers, meetings with our MLA and communication with the district. The PAC is all volunteer run and all of our executive members work full time jobs in various industries in addition to their executive responsibilities. Attending a PAC meeting does **not** mean you'll be asked to sign up for fundraising or planning activities. The main purpose of the meetings is to keep parents informed, share ideas, and provide a voice in school decisions. Volunteering is always optional—there's no pressure to commit to extra responsibilities


