## Attendance

One of the things noticed in the 2024/25 school year is greater student absences. While there may be extenuating factors that impact this, research shows a strong positive correlation between regular attendance and student achievement and success.

I understand this message does not apply to all families but felt it important to identify trends and recognize the importance of regular attendance. If there are any issues you would like to discuss regarding your child's attendance, or areas where the school can support your child, please contact your child's teacher or me directly.

#### **Substance Abuse Prevention**

The Ministry of Education and Child Care, in partnership with adolescent clinical psychologist Dr. Hayley Watson from <u>Open Parachute</u>, will host three, free virtual sessions for parents, guardians and caregivers that will focus on practical skills you can teach your child and youth (ages 0-19) to prevent substance use and mental health needs.

#### Key takeaways for participants during this session:

- Learn the factors that lead to substance use and mental health needs from a trauma-informed lens
- Focus on prevention rather than intervention/response
- Applies to parents, guardians and caregivers of all age groups (youth aged 0-5, 6-10, and 11-18)
- Learn ways that these skills can be applied to yourself and the rest of your family to support the mental health of parents, guardians and caregivers

# **Skating Field Trip**

Once again, we will be visiting the Poirier Recreation for our skating field trips. The field trips will take place between February 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. Your child's teacher will provide all of the relevant details and information.

### **Cross-Catchment Applications**

Parents sometimes wish for their children to attend a school that is not their catchment school. In such cases, parents must first register at their catchment school, then apply for cross catchment. Information for parents who wish to apply for cross- catchment can be found on the Coquitlam School District website. The cross-catchment application process opens on February 7<sup>th</sup> and closes on February 12<sup>th</sup>. There is a process for kindergarten students, and one for students in Grades 1-12. Forms will be available online on February 7<sup>th</sup>.

### **Seymour Field Trip**

We are planning a school-wide field trip for February 25<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> at Mt. Seymour for tubing and tobogganing. Additional information and details will be provided by your child's teacher, and appropriate forms will be made available online. We will divide the school in half and the trips will be on 2 separate days, February 25<sup>th</sup> for Divisions 5,6,7,8,9 and February 27th for Divisions 1,2,3,4. Please have your child bring appropriate clothing, including waterproof gloves, snow boots and snow pants. It will have significant impact on your child's experience if they become wet at the start of the activities.

## Pink Shirt Day- February 26<sup>th</sup>

We encourage students to wear pink shirts on February 28<sup>th</sup>. On Pink Shirt Day we affirm our commitment to stand against bullying and to accept and respect all people, to take time to understand different points of view and share experiences. #### Winter Weather

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

#### **Buses during Extreme Weather Conditions**
