Moving/Kindergarten Registration

Are you planning to move over the summer? If so, this information would be helpful to us in our



planning for the new school year. Our staffing is based on the number of children registered for the 2014-2015 school year. As well, it is critical for our September staffing that we register all Kindergarten students who plan to attend Hazel Trembath in September 2014. If you know of any families in the neighbourhood who haven't yet registered their children for Kindergarten, please encourage them to do so immediately.

PLANNING FOR 2014 - 2015

We are anticipating an enrolment of approximately 155 students for September 2014. Student classroom placement has been done tentatively in early June and will be finalized after the first week of school in September.

To accommodate any flow of students over the summer and in the first week of September we will be using this time during the first week back to establish some school wide goals and expectations and base our first week around a school-wide theme.

Class Building at Hazel Trembath

We are in the process of organizing our school for next year based on our projected enrollment and I would like to take the opportunity to outline this process for you. In September, we will review our actual numbers of students and reorganize if necessary. The configuration of our organization will be one that provides an optimum balance for students. Balance will be achieved this year by having a combination of blended and straight classes.

Within our proposed organization, the process of placing students into classrooms involves a great deal of thought, care and consideration. First, the Student Services team creates a placement card for each student that indicates any special needs or requirements a student may have. Teachers then articulate and discuss each student in their current class with the Student Services teachers and add any additional information to the card that needs to be considered in their placement. Teachers, then work together to place each student in a learning environment that we feel is Our objective is to create a best for them. classroom composition which is balanced and meets the learning needs of all students.

Last Day of School Procedures


The last day of school for students is Thursday, June 26th. Our formal program of instruction will end at Noon on that day and students will be dismissed at 12:05 p.m.
