Dear Parents/Guardians:

There are many exciting programs taking place at Hazel Trembath School. In the area of **Social Responsibility**, "***Hazel's Helping Hands***", a committee of about 20 students led by Ms. Shinkewski and Ms. Safarik, have coordinated fundraising efforts and have raised almost \$2,000.00 so far to support families in Haiti. Their next mission is to collect diapers and formula for Haiti's babies, who desperately need our help. Students and staff are also involved in the "***Cold Weather Mat Program***" to provide meals, socks and necessary items for the homeless in our own community. In an effort to provide more formalized leadership opportunities for students at school, we are asking any interested students to join us in the library this Thursday (Feb. 11th) at lunchtime to learn how they can become ***HT Peer Helpers***. These student leaders will play a leadership role in the school and will have the opportunity to participate on existing committees and to plan exciting school-wide activities, such as Wacky Hair Days and PJ Days for students. Please encourage your son or daughter to attend the leadership meeting Thursday if you think they would benefit from this experience.

In the area of **Environmental Responsibility**, we are a "Green School". We have registered for ***Lights Out Canada***, which is a Canada-wide initiative to have lights out for the day on April 22. We will be talking with students about energy conservation and encourage families to extend this initiative at home also. Tomorrow, students will have the opportunity to participate in the ***BC Hydro's Energy Challenge Program***, which will be a presentation to all students in the morning followed by a specialized workshop for all grade four students. The ***OWL Rehabilitation Project***, a bird sanctuary in Ladner, which also cares for orphaned and injured wildlife, will be coming to our school and bringing in wildlife on March 10th. Parents are welcome to attend. We are also registered to participate in ***Operation Clean Sweep*** this spring and plan to host this annual event with a litterless lunch and grounds clean-up. Our long term planning in Environmental responsibility includes a ***Solar Panel initiative*** and our involvement next year in ***Project Wild's school-wide workshops***.

We have a number of extra-curricular **Physical Education** programs being offered. The ***Hazel Trembath Hockey League*** is in full-swing with organized games taking place three lunch-hours a week. Thanks to Mr. Mariotti for supporting this popular program. Grade five ***Basketball*** is underway with our girl's team and our boy's team practicing before school and at lunch twice a week. In running, we are looking forward to our annual participation in ***Marafun*** this year at BC Place and the ***running program*** which leads up to this event.

To support our **School Goal: Improving Students' Skills in Writing**, we are in the process of setting up our own ***Hazel Trembath Publishing House***. Our committee of teachers and parents are working together as partners to improve student learning, which is the most important work we do at school. We intend to be publishing student's works this spring with a very creative binding and marbling effect our committee has learned about from a recent visit to Porter Elementary School's Publishing House.

REPORTING

Second Term Formal Reports go home on March 19th. Please be reminded that this report is just a snapshot of your child's learning over a course of 2-3 months. Teachers assess the students throughout the year and provide feedback in many ways. The formal reports are designed to report on *what your child is able to do, what your child should be working on or towards, and ways in which we as teachers and the school are going to support your child's learning*. We are also required to report on a child's learning in the areas of Social Responsibility and Social Emotional learning. It is not possible to provide feedback on all of the learning outcomes in one report and therefore we encourage parents as active participants in their child's learning to inquire daily as to what your children are learning at school and how it can connect to their development and daily lives. If at any time you have questions about your child's learning in class, please have a conversation with your child's teacher and work together to ensure that your child is getting the most out of their learning environment.

As in the first term, teachers will contact those parents they wish to meet to arrange for Parent/Teacher interviews, which will take place **before** reports go home. Parents, who wish to meet with their child's teachers after they have received their report card, are to indicate this request on the report card cover and return to school. Teachers will contact those parents who have requested an interview and set up a time that works well for you both to meet.

We believe this process offers some benefits to the sign-up format that usually takes place on a day after report cards have gone home. Teachers will now have the opportunity to confirm meetings with those parents they would like to meet to discuss student progress, and this can be done in a pro-active way.

Parents who would like to participate in a parent / teacher interview will continue to have the opportunity to do this and arrangements can be made for this meeting to take place at a time that is good for both teacher and parent.

Parent/Teacher Interviews will be held on Thursday, March 18th. Please remember that all students are **DISMISSED AT 1:45 p.m. ON THURSDAY, MARCH 18th for Parent/Teacher Interviews. Morning Kindergarten students will also be dismissed early at 10:20 a.m. on Thursday, March 18th.**

STUDENT LED CONFERENCES:

On Thursday, March 4th we will hold Student Led Conferences at Hazel Trembath.

On this day, all students will be dismissed at 1:45 p.m. and the morning kindergarten students will be dismissed at 10:20 a.m.



Every child at Hazel Trembath will be involved in a conference. Teachers and students prepare for the event together, setting the agenda, preparing and practicing. Conferences are intended to highlight student learning, the successes and the struggles the student has experienced. The conference usually lasts about 20 to 30 minutes. Usually, four or five students have conferences at the same time. Teachers do not directly participate in the conference; however, they are present in the classroom and may be included in the conference at certain points. This is definitely not a time to conference with the teacher; it is your child's time to shine for you. Please be sure to write this date on your calendar and participate, as this event is a very rewarding one in your child's learning journey.

PROFESSIONAL DAY–FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 12th

The school will be closed on Friday, February 12th so that the teachers can attend professional development workshops. Students **do not** attend school on this day.

Traffic Safety:

The safety of our children is a top priority.

With the winter season here and the weather being rainy and dismal, visibility is poor on the roads. We would like to remind drivers that we have many children that walk to school on a daily basis using the crosswalks to get to school. Please take time to **SLOW DOWN IN SCHOOL ZONES AND STOP AT CROSSWALKS** to allow children to arrive at school safely.



Traffic & Parking At Hazel Trembath:

Thank you to parents for respecting the no stopping area in front of the school. The front of the school drop off is only for those individuals who have specific physical needs. The expectation is that all families drop off children at the upper parking lots and continue down the stairs to the school. As the weather changes we ask for your extra care and vigilance when you are dropping your children off. Cars entering the upper parking lot are asked to take a large sweep to the right as they are entering and stay tight to the right when exiting the parking lot. On high volume days it is imperative that parents proceed with extra caution. Please review safety expectations with your children if they are walking to school as well. The care for our children is a collective responsibility.

School Assemblies/Presentations:

Please be aware that parents/guardians are welcome to attend all of our Assemblies and also any special presentations that may occur at Hazel Trembath. We will hold monthly assemblies and we hope you will join us! **Our next school wide recognition assembly will occur on February 24th at 9:00 a.m.** Several students will be recognized from each class for their efforts to date. We will also have some student performances and activities related to our social responsibility goals. Watch the newsletters for other special presentations, the next one being the **presentation by "SWARM" on Monday, April 26th at 9:00 a.m.**

DROP OFF REQUEST – Early Morning

Teachers are extremely busy in the morning preparing and planning for the day's lesson. Prior to 8:25 a.m., we cannot provide adequate supervision of our students on the playground. School doors do not open for students until 8:40 a.m., however, we will have some supervision after 8:25 in designated areas. Parents are encouraged to supervise their children until the 8:40 bell and to help establish socially responsible expectations when waiting to come in to school each day and after school before going home. As a community we are all responsible for the well being of our children. Thank you.

SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER:



Occasionally it is necessary for the School District to close schools due to inclement weather (usually long-term power outages or snow).

In the case of extreme weather conditions, the Superintendent of Schools has authority on behalf of the Board, to temporarily close a school.

As a general expectation, parents should be advised that schools are open. If parents believe the local conditions are unsafe, they should keep their child at home or arrange his/her early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations CKNW (980), CKWX (1130) and CBC (690) by 8:00 am if possible. Also, please check the School District 43 website for updates.

Student Absences:

For the safety of all students we request that you call the school before 8:50 a.m. and either relay the information to Mrs. Bolzan or leave a message on the answering machine with any student absences, whether it be for the entire day, half a day or to report that the student will be late. Please remind your child that they are to check in at the office when they arrive late. If a student is marked absent, it is our procedure to call the parent at home first, then at work and then to call the emergency contact *to ensure the safety of the student. This is a necessary, but very time consuming process, so your help in this matter is very much appreciated.*

Cross Catchment:

Those wanting to apply for cross-catchment schools for Kindergarten can do so as of February 8th at 9:00 a.m. until February 17th at 4:00 p.m. by applying online at www.sd43.bc.ca or by downloading the cross-catchment form and returning it to the school board office at 550 Poirier Street, Coquitlam V3J 6A7, by February 17th (**no faxes will be accepted**). These forms will also be available at all elementary schools beginning February 8th. The District's response to kindergarten cross-catchment requests will be communicated to parents/guardians in writing by March 5, 2010.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS

We are in the process of submitting the names of our grade 5 students to their respective middle schools for next September's enrolment. Most of our students will be attending Citadel Middle School, however some of our students do not live in the catchment area for Citadel Middle School.

If you do not live in the Citadel catchment area but would like your child to attend Citadel, or you are in the Citadel catchment area but want to attend a different school, you will need to complete a Cross-Catchment form. Cross-catchment forms for Grades 1-12 will be available **as of February 18, 2010 at 9:00 a.m.** on our School District website: www.sd43.bc.ca Parents will be able to use a link on the website to access an electronic version of the form and will be able to submit it electronically. It is preferable that parents complete the online form, however paper forms will also be available at all sites for parents not wanting to use the electronic process. The forms will be available at our school office as of February 18th.

Completed paper forms must be returned only to the School Board Office. The District's response to cross catchment requests will be communicated in writing by mail by April 1, 2010. **Submission deadline is March 18th, 2010 at 4:00 p.m.** Where space is limited, date and time of application will determine priority.

School Goals: 2009 – 2010

Our new school goal this year is to improve students' skills in writing. Our main objective is to increase the number of students who are fully meeting and exceeding expectations in writing at all grade levels. To accomplish this objective, we will be opening a Publishing House as mentioned on the cover page and will continue to assess students' writing skills by participating in school-wide writes using performance standards and reviewing their work during teacher collaboration sessions each term. Teachers will also engage in collaborative grade group meetings every six weeks and work with a literacy support teacher each Monday to support the improvement of students' skills in writing.

Our school is also focusing on being socially and environmentally responsible. It is our responsibility to ensure a safe and happy learning environment for all students. To help achieve this, it is expected that students keep their hands and feet to themselves and that they include others while playing outside at Recess and Lunchtime. When students are having problems, they are expected to solve problems in peaceful ways.

One of the strategies we will be teaching students to solve problems peacefully is the use of The Three Steps. This problem solving process is outlined as follows:

The Three Steps: Explicit Feedback

The Three Steps will help students to solve problems in peaceful ways. It is based on a clear and straightforward process whereby students take the:

First Step by giving feedback to other students who are treating them in a way that they want stopped. If the unwanted behavior continues, students go to the:

Second Step and inform the other student that if they don't stop, it will be their responsibility to report them. The:

Third Step is when a student reports the problem to an adult.

All students and staff members are being trained in the use of the Three Steps and we will continue our work with students to help them solve problems peacefully.

When students act out inappropriately and treat one another in unacceptable and hurtful ways, the Principal will be involved. Mr. Gordon will work with students who make unwise choices through a process called **Behavior Support**. This process involves helping students to reflect on their own unacceptable behavior and having them think of more appropriate ways of treating one another. Behaviour Support is a positive and dignified way to help students learn from their mistakes and to take responsibility for their actions. Part of this process is for the Principal to inform parents in the event that their child has been involved in a conflict and to let them know how the situation was handled at school. We will continue to teach all students this strategy of solving problems in peaceful ways and look forward to continued improvement in socially responsible behavior at school.

Canadian Tire Money "Fundraiser"

Hazel Trembath Elementary is collecting **Canadian Tire Money** on an **ongoing** basis. This money will go directly back to your children in the form of new learning resources and equipment. Each classroom has a box to collect Canadian Tire Money which is picked up every Friday, with the results posted on a special board in the front lobby.



HAZEL TREMBATH IS ALLERGY AWARE:

Hazel Trembath has become a "**Scent Free**" **School** as we have staff members who suffer from reactions to perfumes and scents. We ask that you consider this when sending your children to school and for those times when you are volunteering or helping at the school. There are many products that can be used that will reduce the risk of a scent reaction by those affected. We have displayed a sample of these products in the office window for our community to see. Please respect the right of all our staff to a scent free environment. It is greatly appreciated.

PEANUT FREE ZONE:

We have several children attending Hazel Trembath who have life threatening allergies to peanuts/nuts. We would encourage parents to try to avoid sending items to school that contain peanuts.



If your child brings a lunch/snack containing any nut products, they will be asked to eat their lunch in a designated area outside of the classroom.

Heart Health for Kids



Establishing a heart healthy lifestyle early on can help keep the risk of heart disease low. The three key aspects to heart health are:


