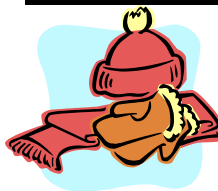

Professional Development Day:

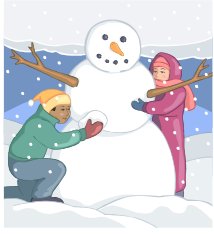
There will be NO school on Friday, February 22nd as this is a School Professional Development Day for all school staff members.

Dress Warm!!



With the inclement weather upon us, please ensure that your child comes to school dressed appropriately for the weather. Unless it is raining very hard, students will go outside at recess and lunch and **must** have warm clothing (i.e. warm jacket, toque or hat, mittens, scarf, etc.) or rain gear. It would be very useful for all students to have a change of clothes at school. The playground gets very wet and slippery and we often have students who get wet and muddy.

SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER:



Occasionally it is necessary for the School District to close schools due to inclement weather (usually long-term power outages or snow).

In the case of extreme weather conditions such as ice, wind and/or excessive snowfall, the Superintendent of Schools has authority on behalf of the Board, to temporarily close a school.

As a general expectation, parents should assume that schools are open. If parents believe the local conditions are unsafe, they should keep their child at home or arrange his/her early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations CKNW (980), CKWX (1130) and CBC (690) by 7:30 am if possible.



Kindergarten Registration

All parents/guardians registering children for Kindergarten (those children who will turn 5 by December 31, 2013) MUST register at their neighbourhood schools. If you have not already registered, please do so as soon as possible.

Please note that siblings of students in attendance at a school are considered as a catchment area child at that school.

Our staffing is based on the number of children registered for the 2013-2014 school year. Thank you for your help in getting the word out around the neighbourhood about Kindergarten Registration. If you have a new neighbour with school-aged children, please check that they have registered for the fall. Also, if you are moving out of the neighbourhood, please let us know as soon as possible.

When Can My Child Start Kindergarten?

Children who are five years old before December 31, 2013 may enter school in September 2013. You may defer your child's enrolment until September, 2014.

When Should I Register My Child? Kindergarten registration for all programs (except Montessori, Bilingual Mandarin, Reggio and French Immersion) within School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) will be held on February 5, 6, 7 in all Elementary Schools. **Registration for Early French Immersion will be done online from January 18-25, 2013. Should I Bring Anything for Registration?

Please bring along proof of citizenship for parent **and** child (i.e. birth certificate, PR Card, Passport, Canadian Citizenship Card)

Also Proof of Residency in B.C. (one of): Rental Contract, Property Purchase Agreement, Income Tax Statement or Property Tax Statement.

And (two of) the following: Utility Bill, BC Drivers License, BC Vehicle Registration, Canadian Bank or Credit Card Statement, BC ID

Proof of Guardianship: please refer to "funding Eligibility Checklist" on the District website or contact your neighbourhood school.

Information regarding Kindergarten and parent meetings should be available at every school at the time of registration.

Can I use my childcare facility address to determine my child's school attendance area?

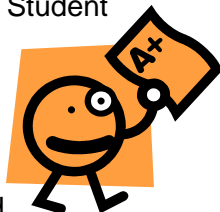
According to the School Act, enrolment can only be based on the home address. All students must be registered for Kindergarten at their catchment area school on February 5, 6 or 7. To determine your catchment school, access the School Locator on the District website. If parents wish their child to attend an out of catchment school, they will be provided the opportunity to apply for a cross catchment transfer, beginning on February 8, 2013 with the deadline of February 20, 2013 (visit the District website for more information). If enrolment projections show that space is available, cross-catchment transfer applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities: (i) catchment area child; (ii) non-catchment area child; and (iii) non-school district child.

Please note that siblings of students in attendance at a school are considered as a catchment area child at that school.

NON-RESIDENTS: Please contact the International Education Department @ 604-936-5769 or visit at 1100 Winslow Ave., Coquitlam. Bring along proof of citizenship for parent and student, proof of residency and proof of guardianship (if applicable).

STUDENT LED CONFERENCES:

On Thursday, February 21st we will hold Student Led Conferences at Hazel Trembath. On this day, all students will be dismissed at 1:45 p.m.



Every child at Hazel Trembath will be involved in a conference. Teachers and students prepare for the event together, setting the agenda, preparing and practicing. Conferences are intended to highlight student learning, the successes and the struggles the student has experienced. The conference usually lasts about 20 to 30 minutes. Usually, four or five students have conferences at the same time. Teachers do not directly participate in the conference; however, they are present in the classroom and may be included in the conference at certain points. This is not a time to conference with the teacher; it is your child's time to shine for you. Please be sure to write this date on your calendar and participate, as this event is a very rewarding one in your child's learning journey.

Traffic & Parking At Hazel Trembath:

Thank you to parents for respecting the no stopping area in front of the school. The front of the school drop off is only for those individuals who have specific physical needs. The expectation is that all families drop off children at the upper parking lots and continue down the stairs to the school. As the weather changes we ask for your extra care and vigilance when you are dropping your children off. Cars entering the upper parking lot are asked to take a large sweep to the right as they are entering and stay tight to the right when exiting the parking lot. On high volume days it is imperative that parents proceed with extra caution. Please review safety expectations with your children if they are walking to school as well. The care for our children is a collective responsibility.

Traffic Safety:

The safety of our children is a top priority. With the winter season here and the weather being rainy and dismal, visibility is poor on the roads. We would like to remind drivers that we have many children that walk to school on a daily basis using the crosswalks to get to school. Please take time to **SLOW DOWN IN SCHOOL ZONES AND STOP AT CROSSWALKS** to allow children to arrive at school safely.

DROP OFF REQUEST – Early Morning

Teachers are extremely busy in the morning preparing and planning for the day's lesson. Prior to 8:25 a.m., we cannot provide adequate supervision of our students on the playground. School doors do not open for students until 8:40 a.m., however, we will have some supervision after 8:25 in designated areas. Parents are encouraged to supervise their children until the 8:40 bell and to help establish socially responsible expectations when waiting to come in to school each day and after school before going home. As a community we are all responsible for the well being of our children. Thank you.

Due to both time constraints and supplier limitations, **the program cannot guarantee peanut free lunches and is not able to accommodate other possible student allergies. Lunch Lady Program:

We are again providing the service of The Lunch Lady Program and these lunches are provided every Thursday to students who have ordered.

Student Absences:

For the safety of all students we request that you call the school before 8:50 a.m. and either relay the information to Mrs. Bolzan or leave a message on the answering machine with any student absences, whether it be for the entire day, half a day or to report that the student will be late. Please remind your child that they are to check in at the office when they arrive late. If a student is marked absent, it is our procedure to call the parent at home first, then at work and then to call the emergency contact to ensure the safety of the student. This is a necessary, but very time consuming process, so your help in this matter is very much appreciated.

Canadian Tire Money "Fundraiser"

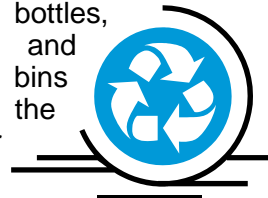

School Goals: 2012 – 2013

We continue to move forward in our goal areas of Writing and Social Responsibility, and we appreciate the support of our parent community as we work toward our goals. Please feel free to inquire on the progress and status of our goals and other school wide initiatives throughout the year. The staff at Hazel Trembath are planning and implementing initiatives for us to improve in our goal areas and we look forward to the rewards that will come as a result of our students' learning.

Literacy Goal: Improve students' Writing skills

Our objective is to improve students' skills in each step of the Writing process. After completing our school-wide write in the fall of 2012, teachers participated in collaboration sessions to assess student achievement and to discuss the results. It was decided that based on this over-all data, and the data represented at classroom, school and provincial levels, that a focus on each step of the writing process would address our goal of improving students' skills in writing.

Other school wide goal areas and initiatives:

As a community, Hazel Trembath promotes **Social Responsibility as a school wide goal and over the past few years has focused specifically on "*solving problems in peaceful ways*". Students will continue to use the "Three Steps" Program to make clear "I" statements to whoever is causing problems and will notify that person, that if they choose to continue with the problem behavior, adult intervention will be sought out. The idea behind these strategies is to give students the skills to advocate for themselves and to build their problem solving capacity.

We will also continue to concentrate on "**Taking Care of the Environment**". We will work together to create a "**Green**" school and establish excellence in education around environmental issues and concerns. We look forward to the growth of our school through the support of parents, volunteers, staff and students and thank you in advance for building a truly great learning community.

Our school focus is to be socially and environmentally responsible. It is our responsibility to ensure a safe and happy learning environment for all students. To help achieve this, it is expected that students keep their hands and feet to themselves and that they include others while playing outside at recess and lunchtime. When students are having problems, they are expected to solve problems in peaceful ways. One of the strategies we will be teaching students to solve problems peacefully is

the use of The Three Steps. This problem solving process is outlined as follows:

The Three Steps: Explicit Feedback

The Three Steps will help students to solve problems in peaceful ways. It is based on a clear and straightforward process whereby students take the:

First Step by giving feedback to other students who are treating them in a way that they want stopped. If the unwanted behavior continues, students go to the:

Second Step and inform the other student that if they don't stop, it will be their responsibility to report them. The:

Third Step is when a student reports the problem to an adult.

All students and staff members are being trained in the use of the Three Steps and we will continue our work with students to help them solve problems peacefully.

When students act out inappropriately and treat one another in unacceptable and hurtful ways, the Principal will be involved. Mr. Gordon will work with students who make unwise choices through a process called **Behavior Support**. This process involves helping students to reflect on their own unacceptable behavior and having them think of more appropriate ways of treating one another. Behaviour Support is a positive and dignified way to help students learn from their mistakes and to take responsibility for their actions. Part of this process is for the Principal to inform parents in the event that their child has been involved in a conflict and to let them know how the situation was handled at school. We will continue to teach all students this strategy of solving problems in peaceful ways and look forward to continued improvement in socially responsible behavior at school.

We will continue to focus on our environmental responsibilities by participating in a number of school-wide and classroom-based initiatives.

CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK – How to get one: Complete the "*Consent for Disclosure of Criminal Record Information*" form (enclosed). Take this form, the *Volunteer Letter from the Principal*, and picture I.D. to the Coquitlam RCMP detachment at 2986 Guildford Way corner of Pinetree Way (604-945-1550). You may receive the criminal record check on the spot or within a day or two.

Health News

Bullying (Ages 4-11) (extract from www.healthy Canadians.gc.ca)



When the cycle starts: The cycle of bullying often begins between the ages of four and 11 when children are forming their own social identities at school and through other activities. No matter when it starts, it's important to remember that *bullying is not a normal part of growing up*. It needs to be dealt with directly by adults who are willing to recognize there is a problem and take whatever steps must be taken to stop it. The different kinds of bullying are:

Physical

Hitting
Kicking
Punching
Pushing/Shoving
Stealing

Social

Gossiping
Rumours
Ignoring
Not including someone in group activities

Verbal

Insults
Name-calling
Threats
Comments about how someone looks or talks
Comments about someone's ethnicity (culture, colour, religion)

Results

- Can hurt a child's body, damage belongings (clothes, toys, etc) or make a child feel badly about himself or herself.
- Can make a child feel badly about himself or herself.
- Can make a child feel alone and not part of the group.

How to help

If a child comes to you for help with a bullying situation, he or she may need reassurance as well as practical advice. Use your judgment about the circumstances and get as many details as you can. Here are some things you can say:

If the child is being bullied:

- *"Stay calm, try to show you won't get upset. Anger can make things worse."*
- *"As soon as you get bullied, find an adult you trust and tell the adult what happened. It is your right to be safe."*
- *"If you are afraid to tell an adult, ask a friend to go with you."*
- *"Stay close to friends or children you know will stick up for you."*
- *"Stay away from places you know bullying happens."*
- *"If bullying continues, walk away and join other children or ask someone for help."*

If the child sees someone else being bullied

- *"Speak out, you can help by telling the bully to stop - nobody deserves to be bullied."*
- *"If you are afraid to speak out alone, ask a friend or many friends to do it with you."*
- *"Comfort the person who was hurt, tell them they don't deserve what happened."*
- *"If you are afraid or telling them doesn't work, find an adult you trust to help you."*
- *"Help children who are bullied. Invite them to participate in your school activities - this will help them not feel like they are alone."*

Assurances you can give children:

- *"Despite how it seems, it is not a hopeless situation. Something will be done to stop the bullying, I will help you."*
- *"There is always someone who you can talk to about bullying, whether it's me or another adult/teacher at school."*
- *"Remember, if you walk away and get help, you are part of the solution. If you stay and watch, you are part of the problem."*
