We are continuing to be diligent on our school grounds by ensuring garbage is brought inside outside of school hours and litter is constantly picked up. If you live in our neighborhood, please encourage your neighbors to also remember to keep garbage secure until the morning of garbage day.



Please note that if a bear, cougar, or coyote is sighted in our neighborhood near dismissal, students must be under the direct supervision of their parent or daycare provider when released by the classroom teacher. Students walking home alone will be kept at school and provided with further instructions from the Principal (or delegate).
