
VALEDICTORIAN VOTE





- Track and Field athletes who wish to participate in the Maple Ridge meet (Thursday, April 25th events start at 3:30 and end at 8:00pm), must email Mr. Tyldesley at mtyldesley@sd43.bc.ca by Saturday at midnight. In the email, include your full name, grade, and the event(s) that you wish to compete in. If you miss the entry deadline you will not be able to compete in the meet. It is a very competitive and well attended meet that I recommend all team members go to since it is the final meet before the District Championships (April 29 and May 2).
- It is highly recommend that all students interested in the 4x100 relay enter the 100m (starting at 3:30pm), and compete in the 4x200m relay.
- For sprinters and distance runners, there is a very unique and rare Sprint Medley relay (200,200, 400, 800).
- Teams for that relay include sprinters and distance runners, and you can assemble your own teams since this is a one-time only race.

ROTARY CLUB OF PORT MOODY

The **Rotary Club of Port Moody** has been awarded a District Grant to hold a Socratic Weekend. Selected students from the Tri-cities will participate June 1 and 2nd in a Port Moody based event in which professionals from a variety of disciplines and roles will come in to engage with the students and discuss a wide range of topics. We will explore Technology and Society, Governance, Mathematics and the science, Conservation and Economic Development, Education and Leadership, Global Markets and the Economy. These experts will be using a Socratic approach to engage with the students, and as such these will not be lectures but rather dynamic participation discussions. The intent of this weekend is to focus on Key themes such as Society, Economy, Environment, Education, Science, Governance, Civil Society (NGOs), etc., and how these all come together/or not, in our current world. The intent is to stimulate, challenge, illuminate and give the students a chance to meet some leaders in their fields. One speaker supplied cameras for the two latest Martian Satellites. This is a fun event, but it will be challenging, and will provide some great insight as to careers and educational paths.

Students applying need to write an essay in Word, maximum 500 words, and submit electronically. The essay to focus on:

- 1)What is the Socratic Method?
- 2)Five key things we need to focus on to ensure the survival of our society?

We will be reviewing the essays for effective writing, content, and will do a word count and check for plagiarism. Essays that exceed the word limit, or involve plagiarism will be rejected. Winners will be contacted Monday April 29th.


