Stay at home when you're sick or have flu-like symptoms. Get plenty of rest!

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick.

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue often when coughing or sneezing and throw the tissue away immediately. It may prevent those around you from getting sick. If a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your bent arm.

Wash your hands. Washing your hands often will help protect you from getting sick. When soap and water are not available, use disposable hand wipes or get sanitizers.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. You can become ill by touching a surface contaminated with germs and then touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Practice other good health habits. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage stress, drink plenty of fluids, eat nutritious foods, and avoid smoking, which may increase the risk of serious consequences if you do contract the flu. 



HOPE, EVEN IN TRAGEDY.

Logan Boulet, a 21-year old hockey player, did not survive the tragic Humboldt Broncos bus crash that killed 16 people in 2018. Logan registered as an organ donor just weeks before the accident and had spoken to his father about his wishes a year before. Logan was able to save six people's lives through his organ donation.

As news spread of Logan's selfless act, thousands across the country and world were inspired to register as organ donors. This became known as the "Logan Boulet Effect". To mark the day Logan Boulet became an organ donor, the Boulet framily launched Green Shirt Day on April 7 of every year.

Start a Challenge

Organize a registration drive at your school or at a community event.

- If 25 students get 25 people to register as an organ donor – ask your principal or teacher to dye their hair green!
- If 50 students get 50 people to register as an organ donor – ask your principal or teacher to wear green man suits and do a dance at the assembly!

Organize a Sports Came

- Students vs teacher volleyball, basketball game or floor hockey
- Teams wear green socks/green face paint/green headbands
- Ask a transplant recipient to give the welcome speech
- People can also take home a registration form or have conversations about organ donation



This year, BC Transplant will award two \$1000 scholarships to Grade 12 students who lead an organ donation awareness project in their school or community in April 2020.

You could organize your whole school to participate in Green Shirt Day on April 7, start a social media challenge or host an organ donor registration drive in your school or community.

You'll need to submit a 500-word essay or short video to showcase your project.







Arts Education Bursary

Annually, two bursaries of \$2,000 each are available for students who have graduated or plan to graduate in 2020 from a high school (public or private) in the Tri-Cities region (Anmore, Belcarra, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam and Port Moody)

Eligibility Criteria

The Theatre Society Legacy Fund – Arts Education Bursary is intended for a student who is enrolled at a recognized post-secondary
institution in a formal arts program anywhere in the world. Arts is defined as a creative activity that expresses imaginative or
technical skill. It produces a product or an object. The product/object of art is called a work of art, for other to experience. It
includes drawing, painting, sculpting, photography, performance art, dance, music, poetry, prose, theatre and culinary arts.

Eligibility Criteria

- To be eligible to apply for the Theater Society Legacy Fund Arts Education Bursary you must meet the following requirements:
- must be enrolled in an undergraduate program OR any year of a post-graduate program at a recognized post-secondary institution in a formal performing arts program anywhere in the world
- demonstrate academic merit
- short essay (500 words) titling: "Arts Why this is my future?"
- summary of your previous and current involvement in Arts (300 words)
- have not received the Theatre Society Legacy Grant Arts Bursary in the previous academic year
- mature or returning students are eligible to apply provided they meet the other eligibility criteria
- applicants do not have to be current residents of the Tri-Cities area but must have graduated from a secondary school in the Tri-Cities region

- Application Deadline March 15, 2020 at midnight

Douglas College Entrance Scholarships Deadline Extended to March 16, 2020



- Douglas College offers scholarships and awards, some up to \$20,000, which could cover a student's full education. In addition, conditional acceptance is no longer required; students simply need to submit the application and supporting documentation, including two reference letters, a 1000-word essay, and demonstrated financial need (if applicable) by the deadline. Once you complete the application form, either paper or on your myAccount, you will be eligible for all 70 scholarships and awards.
- If you have applied to Douglas College I encourage you to apply for an entrance scholarship and award by March 16.

BCIT PATHWAY TO SUCCESS AWARDS

BCIT Pathway to Success Awards are for students planning to enter into a full-time first year technology, technical studies or trade program (excluding Apprentice) directly from high school. Essentially all programs except the 7 week apprenticeship program. If in doubt, please ask!

The intent of these awards is to recognize students who are well-rounded citizens, who have displayed leadership qualities, and have demonstrated that they are willing to work hard to achieve their goals. Commitment and drive are as important as formal academic standing.

Value: up to \$1500 per term for 2 consecutive terms (max \$3,000)

- School District #43 (Coquitlam) 3 awards
- Selection is based on demonstrated leadership skills and/or additional responsibilities such as family. Examples are:
- Leadership training/courses
- Volunteer and/or community service
- Work experience
- Captain/president of sports team or group
- Involvement in extracurricular activities
- · Play a major role in supporting their family, financially or otherwise
- Letter of recommendation from school district (letter should be from a HWSS teacher, counsellor or admin and on HWSS letterhead)

APPLICATION DEADLINE: APRIL 1, 2020

Eligibility Criteria:

- You must have applied for admission to BCIT and have been assigned a BCIT ID
- You must be citizens or permanent residents of Canada
- You must commence your BCIT full-time studies before March 31, 2021
- · A recipient must remain registered as a full-time student during the academic period for which an award is given
- · A recipient must maintain satisfactory academic standing during the academic period for which an award is given
- · Awards are not deferrable and must be accepted in the year in which they are awarded.
- Recipients of a Pathway award are not eligible to receive BCIT entrance award
