



#### Professional Baker






#### ABORIGINAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP CLUB (AYLC)



Lipids in Brain diseases - Check your fats

Lipids are not just a source of energy for the body, their role in cells is far more complex. For example, fatty acids can be attached to proteins in cells, changing the functions of the modified proteins. This process is called "fatty acylation". We will see how abnormalities in protein fatty acylation contribute to brain diseases such as Alzheimer or Huntington's disease.

#### At-Home DNA Extraction

I will be demonstrating how to extract DNA using a piece of fruit, and explaining how the audience can follow along to do it themselves using stuff you'd typically find at home in the kitchen or bathroom. I will also show examples of how the same principles are used in the lab on a smaller scale to extract DNA from yeast and human cells and talk about what scientists do with the DNA we extract.



#### Lester B. Pearson International Scholarship Program

The Lester B. Pearson International Scholarship Program at the University of Toronto is intended to recognize international students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement and creativity and who are recognized as leaders within their school. A special emphasis is placed on the impact the student has had on the life of their school and community, and their future potential to contribute positively to the global community. Awarded annually, these scholarships recognize outstanding students from around the world, including international students studying at Canadian high schools. This is U of T's most prestigious and competitive scholarship for international students. Each year approximately 37 students will be named Lester B. Pearson Scholars.

#### **Eligibility:**

- an international student (i.e. a non-Canadian requiring a study permit)
- an original and creative thinker committed to school and community
- a high achiever in academic and creative pursuits
- enthusiastic about learning and intellectual exploration
- have demonstrated strong leadership skills
- currently in their final year of secondary school
- · intending to begin university in the upcoming academic year
