The <u>UBC Future Global Leaders</u> program is designed for you. For three weeks, learn from top UBC professors as you delve deeper into your academic interests, and discover what teaching is like at the first-year level at a top-tier university. What can you study?

You can choose from seven engaging academic courses, all taught by UBC instructors. This

• Applications for our new volunteer program at Geering Up have opened up! We invite high school students to join us as Leaders-in-Training in our new STEM Leadership Program.

Program Information:

*The UBC Geering Up STEM Leadership Program is a year-long initiative focused on the professional development and training of high school students for the purposes of establishing strong values indicative of a STEM Ambassador. The summer component of the program will focus on training and professional development in addition to volunteer work with Geering Up. This time will provide the Leaders-in-Training with the tools they need to be successful STEM Leaders in the future.

*Leaders-in-training are volunteers who support our summer camps for kids. They will work closely with our instructor team to deliver and share STEM to youth in a hands-on and dynamic learning environment. This program is only open to high school students going into grade 10 and above in September 2021. A full description of the program can be found <u>here</u>. The application deadline for this program is **April 25th**.

Other Upcoming Volunteering Opportunities:

 This summer we also invite high school students and undergraduate university students to join us as Junior Instructors in our summer camps! Junior Instructors are volunteers who support our summer camps by assisting our instructor team with running week-long camps. This volunteer program will run alongside the STEM Leadership Program. It's time once again for the ATLAS Particle Physics Masterclass. <u>Registration is now open on</u> <u>eventbrite</u>. This event has moved online and will now be held over a half day. Activities have been expanded to include a virtual tour of the world's largest particle detector at CERN, the ATLAS experiment.

Intended for grade 11 and 12 students, those who enroll in Saturday's masterclass will receive an invite to Friday's tour. This event will be recorded and shared more generally following the event.

During the half-day online event every student will have the opportunity to: Learn about research topics and methods that are fundamental to particle physics Analyze measurements on real data from the ATLAS particle physics experiment at CERN Network with other high school students and researchers to discuss results *TRIUMF* has partnered with *Simon Fraser University*, the *University of British Columbia* and the *University of Victoria* to bring the Particle Physics Masterclass experience to high school students in BC. What is SOYL?

SOYL is a 6-week summer leadership and empowerment program offered by Fresh Roots in partnership with school districts. We run SOYL in three different locations:

- SOYL @ Vancouver.
- SOYL @ Suwa'lkh (Coquitlam).
- SOYL @ Farm Roots (Delta). Those applicants accepted to SOYL will then be enrolled in Delta School District's Summer School Registration.
- The program empowers secondary students to cultivate and steward schoolyard farms for learning, community building and growing Good Food for All. Through their time with SOYL, youth develop skills in growing, cooking, and selling food, as well as a greater connection to themselves, their community, and the regional food system. Youth also receive a stipend and can receive school credit for their contributions.

- The topic for this year's public speaking event is:
- Courts, administrative tribunals, teachers and, even parents strive to present a fair hearing when parties are attempting to resolve a dispute.

How do considerations of diversity and inclusion impact what is "fair" within the Canadian legal system?

The Barry Sullivan Law Cup is a province-wide public speaking competition honouring the memory of Barry Sullivan and his contributions to both the legal and educational professions. Finalists will be judged by legal and academic professionals, which have also included from previous years, Judges from the Courts in British Columbia and representatives from UBC and the media. Students in Grades 10, 11 and 12 from all regions of B.C. are encouraged to apply.

This year's winner will receive a cash prize of \$1,500. Second and third places will receive \$250 and \$150 respectively.

Due to the pandemic, this regularly scheduled in-person event will be hosted online. As such, participants will need to have, or have access to, the following:

- A computer with functioning speakers, camera, and microphone
- · Good internet connectivity to reduce disruptions during the event
- The event will be divided in two parts:

Preliminary Round: Students will be divided into small groups (breakout rooms) to deliver their speeches to the preliminary judges.

Final Round: Winners per breakout room are announced; they will move forward to compete against a smaller group of participants to the championship judges.

- Further detailed instructions about the Zoom event will follow after participant confirmation.
- Due the popularity of this event, schools must limit their registrants to a maximum of five (5) students.

Health Care Access Program: Job Opportunity after graduation

COVID-19 has increased the need for additional staff in long-term care and assisted living services. Typically, these positions require prior experience and education. The Health Career Access Program provides a path for applicants with no health care experience to get hired and receive on-the-job training.

How to get your career started

- COVID-19 has increased the need for health care assistants in long-term care and assisted living services.
- Normally, to become a health care assistant, you must complete six to eight months of post-secondary education at your own expense before you can apply for a position.
- Through the Health Career Access Program, the Province will pay for your post-secondary education.

New hires in the program start in a health care support worker position and receive paid training that leads to full qualification as a health care assistant.

Please note: All successful program applicants must start as a health care support worker before advancing to a health care assistant position.

Health care support worker

- Health care support workers are supervised by registered nurses or other regulated health care professionals. They provide a variety of critical non-clinical, non-direct care supports to patients and residents.
- Typical duties include:
- Participating as an integral member of a healthcare delivery team
- Establishing a caring relationship with clients, residents and families
- Providing support and assistance with mealtime activities
- Providing support and assistance in carrying out activities
- Performing housekeeping duties
- Greeting and directing visitors
- Restocking supplies
- Completing and maintaining relevant records
- Health care support workers earn \$20.95 an hour.

Summer STEM Institute

Making research and mentorship accessible to high school students.

The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) is a 6-week virtual summer program from June 20 to August 1, 2021. SSI is an international program that provides academically talented and highly motivated students the opportunity to learn through a data science and research bootcamp, a Masterclass lecture series, weekend challenges, and a mentored research project.

- Bootcamp: learn how to design and conduct a data science research project.
- Pursuing research in high school is difficult. Many students are scientifically curious and are eager to conduct research but often lack the right training to do so. The SSI Bootcamp empowers motivated high school students with the training to conduct data science research projects.
- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) program was started last summer by educators, students, and graduates from Stanford, Harvard, and MIT. Last year, SSI received over 2,450 applications from students in 78 different countries.

Many students who attended the program said SSI changed their lives and asked for the team to continue running SSI in future years. Applications for SSI 2021 have just opened.

The program consists of three main parts:

- Research and data science bootcamp: Students learn how to design and conduct data science research projects. Students learn
 about the research process and how to apply statistical and machine learning methods to address scientific questions with realworld impact.
- Masterclass lecture series: Students are connected to accomplished young adults around the world. Students have the opportunity to learn about entrepreneurship from Forbes 30 Under 30 recipients, science research from International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) grand prize winners, and other topics from speakers with diverse backgrounds and experiences.
- Mentored research project: Students complete a research project through a rigorous, hands-on learning experience under the guidance of mentors. Previously, students have worked in a variety of fields, from computational biology to quantum physics.

- Ability to commit to a minimum of 2 weeks of volunteering (Non-consecutive weeks is acceptable).
- Attend volunteer training.
- A Criminal Record Check (free of charge) will be required upon accepting a position with SFU Camps.
