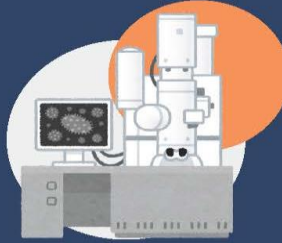

# BC Excellence Scholarship

- There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners demonstrate service and leadership, both at school and in their communities. Winners also show aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a \$5,000 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition.
- You **must be nominated by your school** to apply for this scholarship. Only one student from each school may be nominated. The nomination information is on the HWSS Scholarship website.

# BC Excellence Nomination process

## ONE student can be nominated from HWSS

- **Application for nomination:**

- You must submit everything required for the online application (resume using the online template, two reference letters, written statement using online template) PLUS a copy of your most recent transcript from Student Transcript Service. **DO NOT** complete the BC Excellence Nomination Form - only the one selected student will complete that form.

**January 15, 2025 12:30PM DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR NOMINATION**

- Students selected as conditional recipients of the BC Excellence scholarship must meet the following requirements **by August 31 of their graduating year** to be confirmed as a recipient and receive their scholarship voucher:

- [meet basic eligibility requirements;](#)
- be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma);
- fulfill the requirements of the B.C. Graduation Program;
- be graduating in the same year the scholarship is awarded; and
- have the following final marks.
  - Minimum "B" average in grades 11 and 12 courses required for graduation.
  - Minimum "B" (73% or above) in Language Arts 12.
  - Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" (67% or above), and no marks lower than "C+" in courses that fulfill graduation requirements for Science 11 or 12, Math 11, and Social Studies 11 or 12.
