- The Port Moody Police Department is hosting a free program for youth in Grades 11-12.
 - The program is designed to introduce students to policing as a career and will allow students to earn volunteer credits (30 hours) that you can apply towards graduation.
 - The program will be run out of the Port Moody Police Department on St. John's Street

- Youth ages 15 to 30 (per the funding eligibility requirements from Service Canada).
- Can work well independently and/or as a team member.
- Has volunteer or paid experience working with children and/or recreation.
- Is responsible, enthusiastic and possess strong leadership skills.
- Has an active First Aid Certificate.
- Will be required to complete clear Police Information Checks from both your local Police/RCMP Detachment and Ministry Criminal Records Review program, upon offer of employment.
- Must be available for the full 7-week commitment of the camp (1 week training, 6-week camp).
- Applications must include your resume, copies of current valid relevant certificates, and 2 references.

- **3. École Pitt River Middle Community School - Port Coquitlam**
- Start date will be approximately June 23, 2025
- These are full-time (summer) positions - Leaders will work 35 hours per week for a 7-week period
- (1-week mandatory training / 6 weeks of camp)
- Hours: 8:00 am – 3:30 pm
- **Junior Leader pay rate → \$20.00 per hour + 4%**
- **Senior Leader pay rate → \$23.00 per hour + 4%**
