- · Describe "your community" in your essay.

Possible prompts to help elaborate your response:

- · What was your role in the volunteer work? What specific volunteer service did you provide?
- · What were your responsibilities? What did you accomplish? How many hours did you serve?
- Upon reflection, what did you learn from your experience? How has this experience influenced your future direction?
- What program are you planning to study? How will your community service assist you in this path?
- · Feel free to add any additional information to complete your answer.

Applications are due June 18^{th} , 2025, and can be submitted to either Heritage Woods Career Centre or to your local Village Hall (Anmore or Belcarra).
