





### Dr. Bill Morrison (Métis & Cree)

Professor of Biomechanics, BSc(PE), MSc, PhD in Biomechanics

Realized **traditional knowledge** was valuable and comparable to academic knowledge and saw science as a **label** for what he already knew from traditional life.

Integrating Indigenous Knowledge in Science & Work

#### 1. Indigenous Knowledge and Science

- Science emphasizes measurement, prediction, and control
- •Indigenous Knowledge values respect, relationships, and cooperation
- •Integration requires mutual respect, patience, and learning from failure

#### 2. Incorporation in Work

- •Encourages self-awareness and personal connection to tasks
- Promotes experience sharing for deeper understanding
- \*Builds community through mutual respect and collaboration


