PMPD Intro to Policing for Grade 11 & 12s

SECTION 1

The Port Moody Police Department is hosting a **FREE** program for local youth currently enrolled in Grades 11 & 12. The program is designed to give youth an understanding of policing as a career and will allow students to earn volunteer credits (30 hours) they can apply towards their graduation. The program will take place out of the Port Moody Police Department headquarters located at 3051 St Johns Street. The dates & times of the program are as follows:

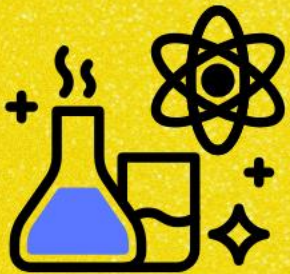

Participants are required to attend all 7 sessions in their entirety. Each day will have a different theme and there will be demonstrations from various specialty units including the Police Dog Services and Forensic Identification Services. There will be opportunity for participants to experience hands-on components in a training environment (for example: traffic stop scenarios, use of force, drill). There will also be a fitness component to this program and applicants will be required to self-report their physical abilities in section 5 of this form.

Applicants will be required to receive parental / guardian permission. Applicants will also undergo a basic criminal record search and will require their principal's endorsement to participate. **Priority will be given to students who reside in Port Moody.**
