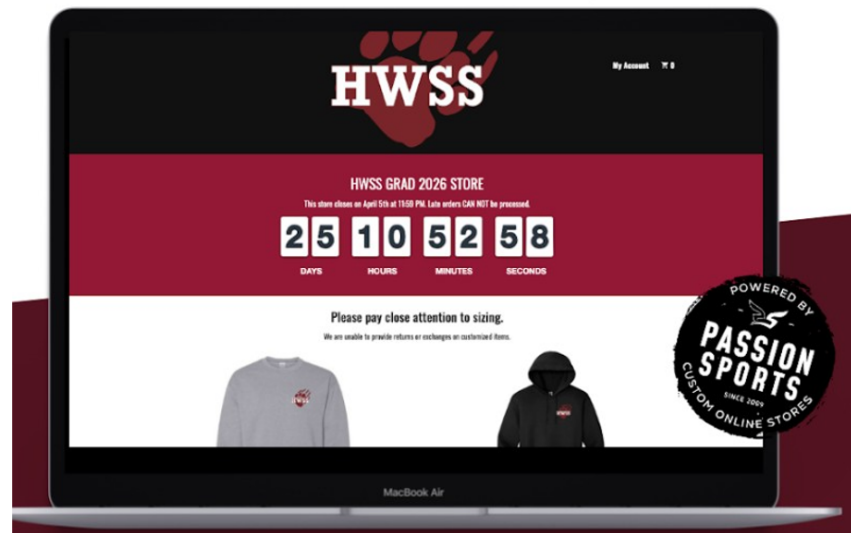

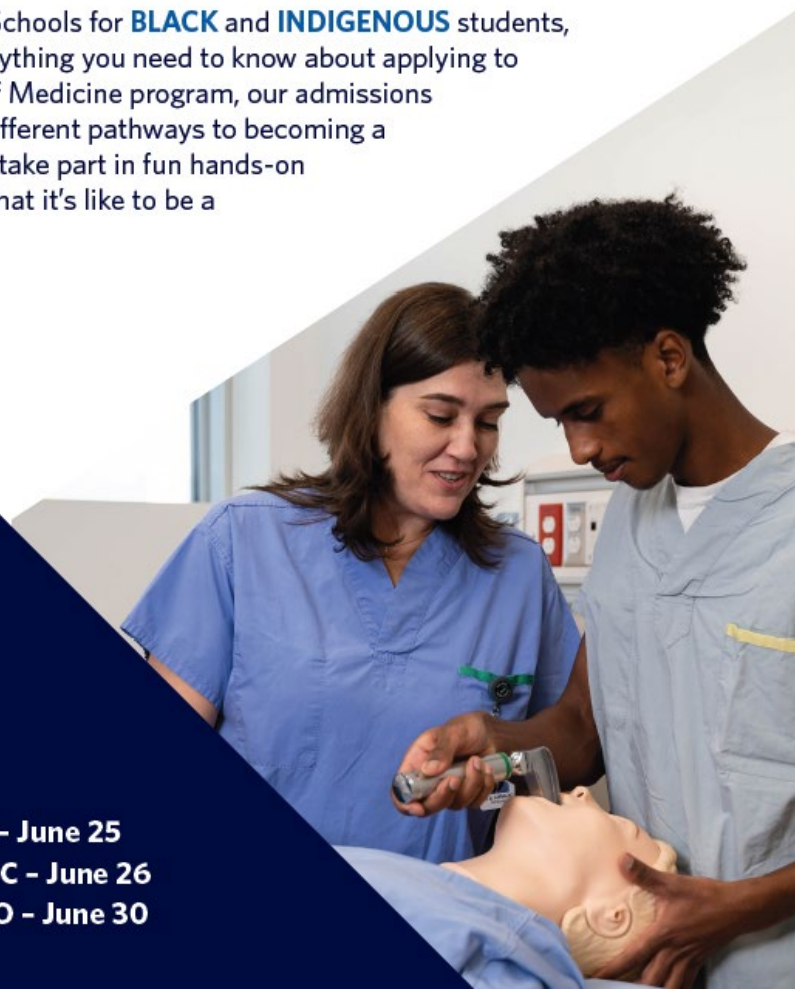

## INDIGENOUS MD ADMISSIONS WORKSHOP

JULY 8-10, 2026

The 23<sup>rd</sup> annual Indigenous MD Admissions Workshop will take place on the unceded territory of the Lheidli T'enneh at the Northern Medical Program, located on the University of Northern British Columbia campus in Prince George, BC.

### EXPLORE A FUTURE IN MEDICINE

If you are thinking about pursuing a future in medicine, this is a unique opportunity to learn how UBC can support you in your studies and connect with an inclusive, caring community of medical practitioners, students, and faculty.

Our annual pre-admissions workshop for Indigenous pre-med students isn't just for those already in university. Prospective students, including post-secondary and high school students can explore what it means to attend university and embark on a journey to becoming a healthcare professional.

### JOIN A CARING COMMUNITY

Being part of a community is important—it helps people feel connected to traditions and knowledge unique to them. At the UBC Faculty of Medicine, we are a community that celebrates our students' diverse perspectives on healthcare and Indigenous ways of knowing.

For twenty-three years we've been providing the Indigenous MD Admissions Workshop dedicated to welcoming Indigenous people into our faculty and supporting you as you make a commitment to study medicine. We know that our annual workshop will give you an introduction to our community and help you feel more confident about your decision to study medicine.

### WHY ATTEND?

#### To learn

- Find out about prerequisites, course planning, and get a preview of the medical curriculum and residency programs.
- Get an overview of the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT), and learn about the UBC interview process by participating in mock interviews.
- Gain familiarity with the application process and admission requirements.

#### Meet faculty & staff

- Hear stories from doctors and faculty who chose UBC.
- Learn about student supports from a member of the Student Affairs team.
- Get the facts about your financial options from the Faculty of Medicine's Student Financial Assistance Officer.

#### Feel supported

- Learn about preparing your application from our Indigenous Initiatives team.
- Better understand specific Indigenous resources and support for students with Indigenous ancestry, including First Nations, Métis & Inuit peoples.
- Hear from a local Elder during the opening and closing remarks.
- Ask questions of Indigenous medical students and residents to learn about their experiences.
- Find out more about what pursuing a career in medicine entails.



If you're feeling apprehensive about pursuing a medical degree, our workshop is one of the best ways to reduce your doubts, fears, or anxieties about pursuing your goal of becoming a medical doctor. You'll gain personal insights and guidance about your choice to study medicine with us.

We are excited about the remarkable students, alumni, and faculty who will be presenting and advising over all three days of the workshop and we hope you'll join us in July 2026.

### WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED

There is *no cost* to attend the workshop.

The workshop will take place in person in Prince George. The university will cover your accommodations and meals, however travel to/from the workshop will be your responsibility.

If public health guidelines change, the workshop may need to shift to a virtual gathering. This will be communicated as soon as a decision is made. Successful applicants will be notified by email.

- A 500-word autobiographical essay, including who you are and why you want to become a doctor.

- A copy of your proof of ancestry such as status, treaty and Métis membership cards. We also accept written letters of support from your Band, Inuit and Métis organizations.

We encourage you to get your application in as soon as possible. If you have any questions about the workshop, please reach out to us.

Emily Carr University of Art + Design (ECU), in partnership with Surrey Schools, the Vancouver School Board, and School District No. 43 (Coquitlam), is proud to support the next generation of artists and designers as they begin their journey to post-secondary education. Through the Head Start in Art dual credit pathway, selected high school students have the opportunity to take a first-year university course at ECU. While still in high school, students can earn both university credit toward an undergraduate degree and high school credit toward graduation, gaining early exposure to the creative learning environment at ECU.

### WHO IS THIS PROGRAM FOR?

The Head Start in Art program is for students who:

- Are currently in grade 11 or 12 or are recent graduates from the secondary schools in the following school districts: Surrey Schools, Coquitlam School District, Vancouver School Board
- Are considering post-secondary studies in visual art, media art or design.
- Want to get a jumpstart on their post-secondary education and earn **dual credit** before officially beginning undergraduate studies.

The course will particularly benefit students developing a portfolio for admission to post-secondary programs.

### COURSE DETAILS

Foundation 108 – Creative Processes (3 credits)

**Dates:** Fall Semester 2026  
**Day + Time:** Saturdays, 9:30am - noon  
**Location:** Emily Carr University

In this course, students will:

- Be introduced to the methods, materials, and concepts of drawing as a visual language and as a tool for enhancing perceptual awareness.
- Begin to acquire the skills to translate immediate observation and ideas into two-dimensional form while investigating processes and developing a critical vocabulary.
- Gain hands-on experience with in-class projects and assignments encompassing various aspects of drawing.
- Explore contemporary and historical art and design ideas through visual presentations and class discussions in a supportive, inclusive environment.

Space is limited.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

As this is a **university-level course**, students must meet all the following ECU academic admission requirements:

- English 11 or 12 (minimum "C" grade)
- Two other grade 11 or 12 academic courses
- Two grade 11 or 12 electives (Visual Art 11 or 12 recommended)
- Overall grade point average of 2.5 ("C+" or 67%)

### APPLICATIONS

In order for your application to be complete, you must submit the following:

- An Application Form (signed)
- Diploma Verification Form OR transcript of grades  
*Note: Students may apply having only completed English 11; however, English 12 and Grade 12 academic and elective classes are the final requirements for future admission to Emily Carr University.*
- A Recommendation Letter from your home school's art teacher (or equivalent)
- Consent form (signed)

Applicant materials must be submitted to the appropriate Career Department at each school district.

Application forms are available through the high school Career Center or on the School District's websites.

### TUITION AND FEES

Tuition for the course is paid by the school district. Students are responsible for the Head Start program fee, which includes the capital refresh, technology, materials and learning access fees. For a full breakdown of ECU mandatory fees, please visit: <https://ecuad.ca/tuition-fees-undergrad>

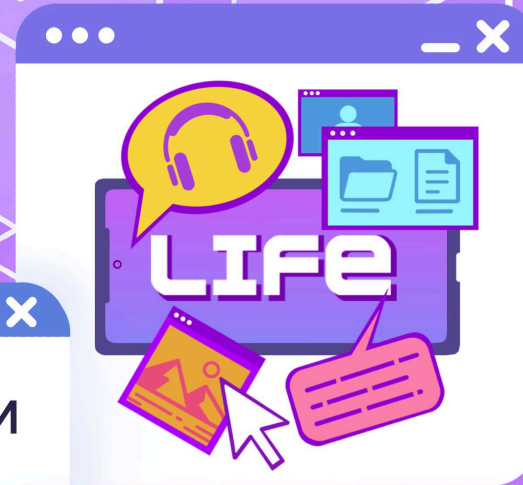

## SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

### Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a Grade 12 student residing in Anmore and graduating from high school.
- Must have plans to pursue post-secondary education. Recipients must enroll in a post-secondary institution within one year and provide proof of enrollment to receive the scholarship.

### Community Service:

- Applicants should demonstrate exceptional community service in Anmore, including volunteer hours. Volunteering specifically within Anmore or with the Anmore Youth Group is highly valued.
- Nominees must demonstrate proof of their academic achievements as well as their extra-curricular activities.

### Application Must Include:

- A personal letter outlining how you meet the scholarship criteria, your future plans and how you would utilize the scholarship
- A letter of reference from the applicant's school, verifying your qualifications.
- A copy of the applicant's interim transcript, covering both Grade 11 and Grade 12. If your interim transcript is not available, please submit the most up-to-date school records and report cards.
- A completed application form, detailing all necessary personal and academic information.

## APPLICATION CONSIDERATION

Scholarship applications received by **Tuesday, May 19, 2026** will be selected by Council in a Closed Meeting following the application deadline. Council may decide not to award the scholarship in a given year, or to divide the scholarship between multiple recipients. Only successful applicants will be contacted.
