- **FOR ELECTIVES** - only choose the grade 12 level course if you have completed the grade 11 level course
- **EAL COURSES** - students should speak with their teacher about their next EAL level or entry to English 10
- **RESOURCE BLOCK** - **ONLY** select if you have been approved by a case manager or counsellor

ALL STUDENTS MUST SELECT 8 INSIDE THE TIMETABLE COURSES AND 1 ALTERNATE IN MYED BC. ADDITIONAL COURSES FALL OUTSIDE THE REGULAR SCHEDULE AND DO NOT 'COUNT' AS ONE OF THE 9 REQUIRED COURSES.
