

### **How Things Work:**

#### Two semesters

- Semester 1: Sept-Jan
- Semester 2: Feb-June
- ✓ Students take 8 courses plus digital literacy over 2 semesters
- Classes are 72 minutes long
- ✓ <u>Flex Blocks</u>: Mon-Fri, 30 mins of tutorial time with a teacher
- ✓ Some students take additional courses outside of the 2-5 block schedule (band, choir, strings, jazz band, athletic programs)

### **Alternate Elective Course**



- ✓ May be used if it is not possible to get one of their top three choices
- ✓ Many reasons a student may not get a course (course conflicts, class sizes, class cancelations, etc.)
- ✓ Putting time into choosing alternate is just as important

## Did you know?

- Language is NOT required for graduation
- Most post-secondary institutions do not require a language
- If you later decide you need a language 11, but did not take a language 9 or 10, you can take the <u>accelerated</u> "Intro11" (9/10)



- If you are out of district, fill out a hard copy of the form and hand it in to the office with your registration documents














Going to High School...
