

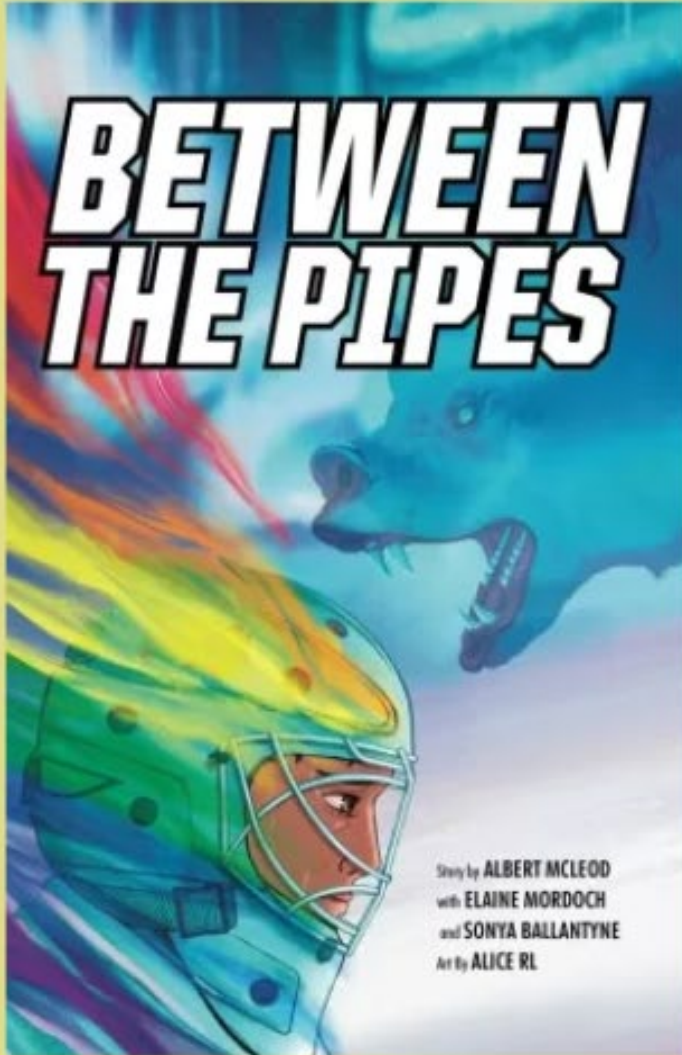

Thirteen-year-old Chase's life and identity should be simple. He's the goalie for his hockey team, the Eagles. He's a friend to Kevin and Jade. He's Kookum's youngest grandchild. He's a boy. He should like girls.

But it's not that simple. Chase doesn't like girls the way that the other boys do. It's scary being so different from his peers. Scariest still is the feeling that his teammates can tell who he is—and that they hate him for it. If he pretends hard enough, maybe he can hide the truth.

Real strength and change can't come from a place of shame. Chase's dreams are troubled by visions of a **bear spirit**, and the more he tries to hide, the more everything falls apart. With the help of an Elder, and a Two-Spirit mentor, **can Chase find the strength to be proud of who he is?**

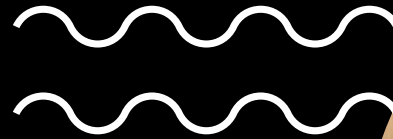

What Is An Umbrella Term?



An umbrella term is a **broad label that includes related topics.**

A few examples of umbrella terms are vehicles, fruit, or LGBTQIA2S+. **Some people identify with the umbrella term itself** (queer, transgender, etc), while **others identify with a specific identity within it** (bisexual, agender, etc). Many people use umbrella terms to simplify explanations, avoid homophobia, or they may feel more connected to the umbrella term, though this does not apply to everybody.

The pass goes on sale starting Monday, June 1, and is valid during school breaks from June 26, 2026, to March 29, 2027.

This year, school breaks include:

- Summer 2026: June 26 to Sept 7
- Winter 2026-2027: Dec 19 to Jan 3
- Spring 2027: March 13 to March 29

What's Included Passholders can enjoy a variety of fun drop-in activities all school year long, including:
