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Principal's Message

As we ring in the 2024-25 school year, we have lots to be excited about at Hillcrest! We hope that your family had a great summer that was filled with great memories 😊

We need parents to step up and volunteer for Hillcrest PAC (Parent Advisory Council) executive positions. It is mandated by provincial law that every school has a PAC. Without one, our school will not have access to extra funding from the province. I urge you to consider volunteering for PAC to enhance the learning experience for your child. Previously, our PAC has provided classroom funds for consumables, money to subsidize field trips and funds for special projects. In addition, PAC funds have given us the ability to purchase extra athletics/PE equipment and to bring in Art Starts performers and guest speakers. Your child benefits greatly when we have a strong group of parent volunteers!

Mr. Wiskar and Mr. Holbrook have been working hard on another collaborative school-wide project like we did last year with the Ancient Civilization Fair. What we learned from that experience will be used to improve our upcoming Renaissance Fair in 2024-25. Our doors will be open for families to help us celebrate all the amazing learning accomplishments.

Other changes to this year will see more student assemblies and adjustments to our Student Leadership Council (HLC). In addition, we will endeavor to make deeper connections with our family of schools (Charles Best, Centennial, Baker Drive, Parkland, RVP, Meadowbrook, Ranch Park and Harbor View). Our staff will continue to offer a multitude of opportunities for our students to join clubs at lunch and after school. Last year we had the following clubs: boardgame, crafting, D & D, chess, cooking, Minecraft, Hot Wheels, Pokémon, yearbook, graphic design, table tennis, book, sewing, coding, newspaper, school beautification, creativity, intramurals and chill zone. If your child has an idea for a club, they should discuss it first with their teacher as all clubs need to have a staff member to sponsor them.

On Thursdays, we have our YMCA youth workers (Joe and Jason) on site who will be here to support our students throughout the day and after school. Part of their mandate is to promote YMCA programming for families in our community. They have an incredible facility located a short distance away that offers a multitude of programs to support families. Stay tuned for more information.

Last Spring, we were able to bring in the following after school programs thorough DWUL: volleyball, soccer, basketball, flag-football, chess, coding and art. 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Babysitting Course Friday, September 20th

Hillcrest will be offering a babysitting course for interested students where they can build their knowledge about babysitting. This full day babysitting course will take place on Friday, September 20th. This is a Pro-D day, so participating students will not miss any schoolwork.

This hands-on course will run from 8:40am – 2:42pm with regular breaks for Nutrition Break and Lunch. At the end you will receive a certificate of completion.

Here are some of the things that students will learn in this course:

- Look after babies, toddlers, preschoolers, and school-age children
- Care for yourself and siblings when home alone
- Create a safe environment and deal with phone calls and unexpected visitors
- React confidently in case of an emergency, such as choking, bleeding, poisoning or burns
- Cope with common problems such as tantrums and crying
- Play games and organize activities to keep kids of all ages entertained
- Manage a babysitting business. This includes creating a resume and a business card and asking the right questions before accepting a babysitting job
- Learn how to correctly fit a helmet to a child (participants are asked to bring a helmet to the course if they have one)
- Students need to bring a pencil/pen to the course

We need a minimum of 20 students to sign up and the maximum is 25 students. The first 25 students to sign up will receive a spot in this course. **Registration starts Tuesday, September 10th at 9:00am on School Cash Online. It will fill very quickly – usually within first 3 minutes.**

Cost for this course is \$39.00
