Principal's Message

On Tuesday, May 27, Ms. Filomarino and I were so proud to watch our Grade 7 Boys and Girls doubles badminton teams bring home district championships for Hillcrest. Shaoqing Yin and Janiece Chan dominated the competition and went undefeated. On the boys' side, Ethan Fong and Ethan Chan had a little tougher road, but managed to fend off Summit Middle to go undefeated. In fact, all of our teams who participated did really well in part because they had such stiff competition while training against who would emerge as the best tandems in SD43!!

It has been a great year at Hillcrest in 2024-25! With the help from PAC and the school district, we were able to see through to the finish line many facility improvements at Hillcrest. The sports court expansion project and the new AV system in the gym are the highlights. Coming soon will be new wrestling mats and work will start on the library courtyard with help from Maxine Wilson. The Ski & Snowboard Club with the help of parent and staff volunteers enabled 150 students to enjoy Cypress Mtn for 4 sessions in February. The Renaissance Fair was an amazing experience for our students to share their learning with the community. A large contingent of family came out to see the displays in the gym and the MPR. As you know from the previous newsletter, we have done a deep dive on tapping into the "data." Attached are the MDI school report for Hillcrest and the results of our own "Street Data." We are moving ahead next year with school action plans to help address our needs that we have pulled from this data. Although our Action Plan for Learning (APL) has yet to be published, you will be able to see how we plan to address our needs in our Human & Social Development goal.

First Week Back in September:

Stay tuned for a revision of how we have done things previously at Hillcrest. I will send out more information in August. Students will stay in their assigned Teams for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Students will move to their homeroom classes on the following Monday (Sept. 8). The changes we are making are intended to ease the transition of our grade 6's and to build connections within our 5 Teams (Eagles, Ravens, Blue Jays, Owls and Falcons).

Grade 6 for a Morning – Thursday, June 5

- 9:15 Students arrive at Hillcrest Gym either by foot with neighboring school staff or dropped off by caregivers.
- 9:50 Student tours and activities begin.
- 11:00 Tour and activities end. Hot dog lunch outside by the sports court.
- 11:30 Students depart back to elementary schools with home school supervisors or are picked up by caregivers.

Athletic Banquet – Thursday, June 12 from 5:00 – 7:00 pm

- All student athletes in grade 6-8 who participated in a school sport are invited to Hillcrest's inaugural Athletic Banquet.
- Tickets are available at the office before and after school from June 4 to June 10. Tickets are **FREE** if your child's athletic fee has been paid in School Cask Online. If you do not see this as an available item, it probably means that you have already paid for it. At Hillcrest, you only need to pay your athletic fee one time (\$20.00) for your child to participate in multiple athletic events (Swimming, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Volleyball, Basketball, Wrestling, Track & Field & Badminton).
- What is an Athletic Banquet? First, the players and coaches will eat together in the Crest Café (weather dependent) from 5:00 to 6:00 pm. Then, we will transition to the gym where the coaches will give a brief speech about their team and present individual awards. To end the awards ceremony, Mr Jacobsen and Mr. Hart will present the major award winners (Athletes of the Year for Grade 7 & 8 and Team Spirit Award) followed by an unavailing of the 2024-25 banner that will acknowledge all of our teams who won a district athletic championship. So far, we have 4 district championships and there is still 2 upcoming district events (Track & Field and Gr. 8 badminton).

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Global Day of Play - Friday, June 6

On **Friday**, **June 6**, Hillcrest Middle School will be participating in the Global Day of Play. While the official international event has already taken place, we've chosen this date to better accommodate our schedule and ensure favorable weather conditions.

The event will run from 10:35 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.

During this time, students will engage in unstructured, screen-free play. There will be no digital devices, structured games, or adult-led activities. The goal is to give students the freedom to explore their creativity, develop problem-solving skills, and build social connections in a spontaneous and independent environment.

In preparation, your child may ask to bring in some unusual or creative items to use during playtime. With guidance from their teachers, students will brainstorm ideas for toys, games, and outdoor equipment they might want to bring. While **digital devices will not be allowed during the event**, students may still need them earlier in the day for regular classwork.

Student Laptop for a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD school)

Q: Why are we doing Bring Your Own Device?

• A: Lifelong learning. Learning doesn't stop at the end of the school day. We believe in the importance of developing creative and critical thinking skills that will serve students in all aspects of their lives. Using a tool like this will allow them to use the device they are already familiar with (or a device that they will become familiar with if it is new) in a new context. They will learn to use it as a tool for learning and presentation of learning and give them the skills they need to be successful in an increasingly technological world as they move into young adulthood. Q: What kind of device will my child need?

• A: The device your child brings will need to have a minimum of a 10-inch screen, as well as a keyboard.

While we can support a variety of devices, we have some recommendations below:

- We do not recommend iPads or Minis. The screens are too small even with a keyboard.
- The district discourages Chrome Books and android tablets. They are unable/not optimized to run some of the software we use in the classroom.
- Think about the size and weight of the device as students will need to carry it to and from school each day. Protective cases are highly recommended.
- Battery Life we encourage you to think about devices that have a longer battery life.
- You do not need to buy a high-end device, but you may want to think about how many years you plan for your child to use this device. We have noticed an issue with devices that have limited Hard Drive Space.
- Students in the district all get Office 365 for free. You do not need to purchase any software.
- We highly recommend students bring a mouse when bringing in a laptop.

Q: What if a family can't afford a device?

• A: The School District is committed to supporting our vulnerable families on a case-by-case basis. If you are unable to acquire a device for the BYOD Program
