This past Thursday, we (Irvine Elementary) hosted an event to raise awareness and pay attention to the importance of emergency drills to prepare us for real life situations. Called the BC Shakeout (which takes place on the third Thursday of October), our school joined more than 1 million other participants in BC (a record setting number) and the more than 30,000,000 participants worldwide to practice the steps we would take should an earthquake occur. We had the media at our school as well as the Honorable Mike Farnworth (MLA), along with representatives from Fortis BC, the Insurance Bureau of Canada, and the BC Earthquake Alliance. Halloween

Halloween is just around the corner. We will be having a Halloween parade through the school on the afternoon of Oct. 31st. We ask that students not wear their costumes to school. Instead, they can bring their costumes to school and will have the opportunity to change into them at lunch time. Doing so means that the costumes won't get damaged or dirty during recess when kids are outside (and if the weather is bad, this only increases the likelihood of a wet, dirty costume and upset feelings). Also, please do not bring any accessories to school as these can get lost or damaged. Finally, I ask that you use good judgement when sending in costumes. No weapons (real or made up) should be brought to school and if you have to ask whether or not a costume is okay to wear, experience has told me that it isn't. Masks are ok, but please keep in mind that students will be going up and down stairs, so they may be asked to remove them if they severely hinder their vision (particularly on the stairs).

Holiday Concert

While it is still pretty early to be talking about the holiday concert in that will be happening in December one of our parents, Shawn Lam, has graciously offered to video the performance of each class. Being able to view your child in this performance is a keepsake that you will enjoy for years. I wanted to put this forward now to let you know that in order to do so, we will require permission for our parent to do

this. While we still need to iron out the details (regarding how you will receive the final product or whether or not a small fee is attached as a PAC fundraiser), I wanted to present this to you now. For those who have completed the necessary forms and have indicated that you are ok with your child being filmed or having his/her picture taken, this will suffice. For those who have not filled out the forms or who have indicated that they wish for their child to not have his/her picture taken, I will be following up to see if an exception can be made for the concert. Thank you to Shawn Lam for offering to do this for our school. As I mentioned earlier, this will be a keepsake that you will enjoy for years!

Staff Parking Lot

Parents, please remember that the staff parking lot should not be used to "drop off" students UNLESS you have an accessible parking permit. For those that have these displayed in their vehicles, you may use one of the two parking stalls at the front of the lot. Thank you.

Also, please refrain from walking through the parking lot with you children, or from having your children walk through the parking lot themselves, especially in the morning (but also in the afternoon as well). There are cars coming in and out of the parking lot and when the weather is bad, this can be a potential safety risk. Instead, if coming from the front of the school, use the sidewalk that runs along the front of the school. If coming from the intersection at Wellington and Renton, either use the sidewalk on Renton, or walk along the north side of the lot and then down the hill towards the portables or down the hill and then around to the sidewalk leading to the front of the school. By doing this, we minimize the risk of a potential hazard. Thank you.
