New Staff at James Park and BCTF Court Ruling

By now I trust that most of you have heard about the court ruling in regards to class size and composition. At the beginning of January, an agreement was reached between the Province, BCPSEA, and the BCTF to provide school districts with \$50 million to immediately begin hiring teachers and improve student supports. SD43 – Coquitlam has received a portion of this money and has hired a number of teachers as result. More specifically, James Park Elementary has received a part time teacher who will be working in area of student services. This will benefit many of our learners and staff as well. I am very pleased to welcome the new teacher – Ms Urszula Siuda – to James Park Elementary, and I hope you will have a chance to meet her in the near future. Although she has been working at James Park as a TTOC for so many days this year, her first official day as a Student Services teacher will begin on Monday, January 30. We also welcome Ms Chand who was the successful applicant for Ms Weiseman's K/1 position. Ms Chand be teaching Ms Weiseman's K/1 class on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

Foundation Skills Assessment

Many of our grade 4 students wrote the annual FSA – Foundations Skills Assessment druing the past weeks. The FSA booklets have to be submitted for marking in the middle of February, meaning that you should receive your child's scores in the third week of February.

School Values and Beliefs

I am hoping that you are aware of our efforts to define who we are as a school community and what values and beliefs we cherish at James Park Elementary. Teachers and students have been engaged in these discussion since the beginning of the school year (and prior to that as well), and many of you have been so kind and completed a school survey in October/November 2016, providing us with good feedback. Taking all of the information into account and analyzing your answers, a list of 23 words has emerged. Students and staff have started to discuss each of the 23 words on the list (meaning, impact, how do these words "look", "sound" and "feel" like in our school), and, even though all of them are important, it is time for us to narrow down this list to the most important ones.
