Respect at James Park

We have been specifically focusing on 'Respect' over the last month. Staff used a number of children's books as discussion starters about 'Respect'. Books your child's teacher may have used were: Be Bigger, What if Everybody Did That?, The Recess Queen, Red - A Crayon's Story, Stand Tall Molly Lou Melon, and The Sandwich Swap. The purpose of highlighting this important topic is for students to think about respect: What does it mean? Look like? Sound like? Feel like? We hope that this discussion is an extension of what you are doing with your children at home on a daily basis. We also recently conducted a school-wide write/draw on the topic. Students' work will be assessed at the beginning of February, collated and summarized in our Achievement Plan for Learning (APL) document available on our school's website.

Family Reading Nights

I hope you will consider bringing your child to family reading night. What's that? Good question! The idea is to emphasize that reading is important and to allow emergent readers to listen to another reader prior to bedtime. Students must bring one parent, may wear their pajamas and bring their favorite stuffed toy to this event. Please refer to the corresponding email or contact the office for more information. We hope to be able to offer Family Reading Night every other Monday evening from 6:00 to 6:45 p.m. If successful, we will inform you of future dates.

Extended Absences

Each year we are approached by parents who wish to take their child out of school for extended periods of time. Usually this is for reasons associated with family plans or family business. We do not have a procedure for granting students a "leave of absence". Rather it is assumed that parents will make decisions in the best interests of their own child. We are respectful of the fact that many of our families have family members far away, and spending time with them is important. Difficulties arise, however, when parents wish to have some sort of reassurance that their child will not be "behind" in their work when they return. If your child misses school for extended periods of time, he or she will be behind in classroom work. Students may well have other cultural and travel experiences that contribute to their overall development, but the many varied daily classroom activities that they will miss cannot be duplicated through worksheets or workbooks. We are not in the position to provide assignments for children who have extended absences due to family plans. Rather we are providing a list of suggested activities that are designed to assist parents with planning for their child's educational needs while traveling. (see next page)

They are as follows:

- Set aside a time each day for reading books
- Have your child keep a reading response journal in which he or she records this activity and thoughts about what has been read that day
- · Keep a scrapbook of special places or sightseeing
- Have your child keep a "math Journal" or ledger, dealing with changes in time and currency, distances traveled, cost of fuel and meals, etc.
