## After School Kamp - ASK - Update

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We are very excited to announce that starting Monday April 11 we will be offering the ASK program at James Park. We are very pleased to have hired Ms Sunshine Hannan to facilitate the program. Ms Hannan is a parent from our community and is very well suited for the position. Students can expect to participate in center type activities, such as lego or blocks, painting and drawing activities, board games and a number of other craft activities. As mentioned in a previous survey, After School Kamp will run from Mondays to Fridays from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.. Parents can sign up their children for any or every day of the week and for any time (either 3:00 to 4:00, 4:00 to 5:00 or 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.). The cost will be \$5 per hour per child. Please be advised that this is not on a drop in basis. Parents must sign up their children and pay in advance. Please keep your eyes open for sign up instructions which we will pass on to you via our students and as a posting on our website. ASK is expected to be a popular afterschool choice for students and parents alike so be aware of first come first serve and potential caps on enrollment should interest exceed program capacity. The ASK program will be an opportunity for your children to spend some quality time at school after 3:00 p.m. and we hope that you will find it beneficial and affordable as well.

The second formal reports will be sent home on Friday, March 11 which is also the last day before our two-week spring vacation. Please keep in mind that a report card is a snapshot of how children are doing. Please do not hesitate to book appointments with teachers if you have questions related to your child's progress at any time during the school year.


Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and peers, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Simister and Porter Elementary School.

One course starts **Tuesday April 19, 2016, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This class will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on May 31, 2016. A second course starts **Wednesday April 20, 2016, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This class will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on June 1, 2016.

Both courses will be held at **Porter Street Elementary School**, 728 Porter St., Coquitlam., Please register with the school office, between Monday April 4, 2016 and Friday April 15, 2016, at telephone # 604-936-4296. Please sign in with the school office prior to going to the multipurpose room to attend the course.

Participants with children under age 5 will need to make their own child minding arrangements. Parenting Wisely courses will be offered again in September of 2016 for parents that are unable to attend the first session of these 2 courses.

four days of hands-on, action-packed activities this **Spring Break** from **Monday**, **March** 

21st through Thursday, March 24th, 2016 for students from grades K-5. The four days of activities will run from 9:00 a.m. - 2:45 p.m. each day.

This unique opportunity is part of a wonderful community partnership between Simon Fraser University and School District 43.
