
Toy-Weapons at School

I would like to begin this portion by quoting from a parent email I received recently. I was hoping that you could maybe address this at school and hopefully send out an email to parents that any sort of weapons, even if they are supposed to be "toys" are absolutely unacceptable on school grounds. In my opinion, it shouldn't really matter whether it's during or after school.

Fact #1: Any use or possession of real weapons on school property is considered an illegal act. Fact #2: Weapon like toys are not real weapons and possessing them is not an illegal act. Fact #3: More often than not, kids using even toy weapons tend to display behavior unfitting for children; play tends to quickly morph to the undesirable: the re-enactment of actual aggression, harm, suffering and even war.

Conclusion: Children bringing even toy weapons to school is discouraged. As such, parents, I am asking for your support: zero toy weapons on school property is the goal. James Park Elementary is committed to being not only a safe place, but a friendly, winsome and positive place to be.
