### Allergy

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Similar to last year, I am hoping you can help and support us. We currently have a student who has a severe and potentially lethal fish allergy. We continue to work with the parents of the child on safety measures – ways to keep the student safe in our school. Even though I recognize that it is difficult to achieve a completely allergen-free school environment, I am asking you to assist us in our school-wide efforts to keep the students safe by considering to not send your child to school with fish related products. Tuna sandwiches would be one more common example of something to please avoid bringing to school. Due to the medically proven fact that the student has had allergic reactions when coming into contact with the allergen (fish and/or fish related products such as fish oil), we will also encourage frequent hand washing for staff and students especially after recess and lunch.

I thank you in advance for your cooperation and please contact me if you have any further questions or concerns.

#### DAYCARE

Please read on if you are interested in daycare at James Park. Due to the licensing process involved for daycare operators, I cannot say the following with absolute certainty, but it appears that James Park will have daycare available for parents and their youngsters possibly starting in December 2016. I met with the daycare operators last week to discuss a few nuts and bolts with them. I am expecting to receive specific contact information next month. ## **Parenting Wisely Course**



Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and peers, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Simister and Porter Street Elementary School.

One course starts **Tuesday October 11, 2016, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This class will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on November 22, 2016. A second course starts **Wednesday October 12, 2016, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This class will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on November 23, 2016.

Both courses will be held at **Porter Street Elementary School**, 728 Porter St., Coquitlam. **Please register with the school office, between Monday September 26, 2016 and Friday October 7, 2016, at telephone # 604-936-4296.** Please sign in with the school office prior to going to the multipurpose room to attend the course.

Participants with children under age 5 will need to make their own child minding arrangements. Parenting Wisely courses will be offered again in January of 2017 for parents that are unable to attend the first session of these 2 courses.

# **Parent Connector Volunteer Job Description**

## Are you a parent or grandparent who:

- lives in the Tri-Cities?
- enjoys working with young children?



• can volunteer 3 hours each week?

## If so, we'd like to hear from you!

### What's Involved:

Working closely with the staff and families at one of 20 Tri-Cities Early Years Centre neighbourhood-based sites. Parent Connectors:

- welcome families;
- help staff and families with activities;
- interact with parents/caregivers and their children;
- give parents with information and referrals to community resources;
- provide cultural/language support, where needed;
- assist with occasional outreach programs in the neighbourhood.

Parent Connectors come from diverse socio-economic and cultural backgrounds. In addition to fluency in English, they may speak another language (e.g. Korean, Mandarin, Cantonese, Farsi, etc.). Parent Connectors will often volunteer at the neighbourhood site nearest to where they live.

If you're interested in becoming a Parent Connector Volunteer, we'll ask you to:

- complete a Criminal Record Check, which is required to work with young children
- participate in an 8-week training program
- commit to volunteering 3 hours/week from January through June 2017

## The Tri-Cities Early Years Centre

The Tri-Cities Early Years Centre is a <u>network</u> of 20 neighbourhood-based Family Resource Programs and Strong Start Centres located across the Tri-Cities.

Each site offers interactive, play-based programs for families with children from birth to age 6, they are designed to help young children learn and grow. Parent and caregivers attend the programs with their children. They meet other parents and community resource people. They get information and referrals to other local resources.

SHARE is the host agency for the Tri-Cities Early Years Centre, and works with many community partners. Funding provided by the B.C. Ministry of Children & family Development through the Office of the Early Years.
