Basically, the Government may fund up to 15% in excess of the new school space (approximately 1800 sq.ft of additional space) to be utilized as the NOL. DISTRICT PAC REPORT

President's Report (Heidi Gable):

A budget meeting organized by the DPAC involving all levels (PAC members, teachers, CUPE members, principals, etc.) to discuss financial structures and government funding will take place some time in January. Discussions about government funding cuts

- Info to be posted on DPAC website
- Encouragement to write letters to government to express displeasure about the cuts

Superintendent's Report (Tom Grant):

Communications with parents, Parents as volunteers, Parental support of children in schools, How to include parents in support of educational decisions, How to support the development of a better community

Coquitlam is the second lowest funded district in the province; Budget meeting will discuss how government funds are allocated

Full-day kindergarten will be phased in over the next two or three years

- Funding for half of all qualifying students will be provided next year
- Government has said that they would let the district know by Christmas how many kindergarten seats will be funded
- Don't know yet whether the province or the district selects the schools that get full-day kindergarten
- Detailed information on each school was given to the government 82% of kids in the district graduate on time every year

New Buildings and Designs - Neighbourhoods of Learning (Carey Chute):

- Four community schools in the district already do something similar
- Began in SD 43 in mid 90s
- Offers a whole host of programs
- Any new or replacement buildings can apply to be considered for the Neighbourhood Learning Centre (NLC) initiative, e.g. Pitt River Middle qualifies
- Ministry may provide up to 15% increase in space for school to house NLC services and programs
- 5 buildings identified for new or replacement buildings
 - James Park Elementary (replacement)
 - Anmore/Heritage Middle (new)
 - Pitt River Middle (replacement)
 - Moody Middle (replacement)
 - Centennial Secondary (replacement) All schools can be considered for the NLC initiative
- Need community to state what they need and then district will seek community groups to provide
- those services
- Groups will not have exclusive use of any given space
- James Park is the first school to start on this process
- Consultation consisted of electronic and paper surveys, meetings with staff and PAC and a community meeting
- James Park info has been presented to Ministry of Education
- Once ministry approves concept, design and planning for space will start
- Pitt River Middle is next school to start with info to be communicated in next 2 weeks
