If your child has COVID-19:

If your child tested positive and are managing their illness at home, you can end isolation when all three of these conditions are met:

- At least 5 days have passed since your symptoms started, or from test date if you
- did not have symptoms.

 2. Fever has resolved without the use of feverreducing medication, such as
- acetaminophen or ibuprofen.

 3. Symptoms have improved.

If they still have symptoms:
They must continue to isolate for longer if they have a fever or are not feeling better. Presence of mild symptoms does not necessarily mean that you are contagious after 5 days. Most people recover within two weeks. Some people with more severe symptoms can take up to 12 weeks or more to feel entirely better

If you are unsure or concerned, connect with your health care provider, call 8-1-1, or go to an Urgent and Primary Care Centre to be

assessed.
