PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

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Happy New Year! I hope you had an enjoyable holiday with family and friends.

HAPPY NFW YFAR!

Unfortunately, we are facing some new challenges to the start-up of the school year due to the surge in Covid-19

cases. To facilitate the return of students to school on Monday January 10th, we will continue to strictly follow all the required protocols:

- Regular hand washing
- Wearing masks in accordance with the Provincial Health Order Maintaining a 2-metre distance wherever possible and respecting physical distancing and the personal space of others
- Completing a daily health check or BC COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool and following the advice provided.
- Staying home when sick.
- Observing the 14-day wait period for return to school after international travel

The staff has spent time this week preparing the classrooms for students to maximize space and ensure wherever possible that students will be seated 2 metres apart.

We have decided not to alter the school schedule, as a result, the start and dismissal time will remain unchanged. Late arrivals, and early dismissals will continue to be facilitated through the classroom door. Every classroom has an outside door and students will be encouraged to keep their physical distance in line ups and to take care not to crowd together. We have created a play schedule for recess and lunch and Students will be assigned to zones by grade level for play time at recess and at lunch. Assigned zones will be changed each day to ensure that all students have opportunities for a variety of activities.

We have reintroduced some of the **floor markings and signage** from last year, and classrooms have been rearranged to maximize space between people

Access to the school will be limited to school and district staff. All staff and parent meetings will be held virtually.

We ask that parents send their children to school each day with one or more well-fitting masks. We will continue to provide masks at the office for students who need one.

Students should also be prepared for the wet weather and should have a complete change of clothes at the school.

The health and safety of students and staff is our top priority, and we will work diligently to keep everyone safe.

Parents must apply in this time period for their child to be considered for placement. Selection will be done by a random lottery draw with priority given to younger siblings of students who will be attending the Program of Choice at the same school in September 2022.

Children who are not successfully placed will be on a waitlist and must register for kindergarten at their catchment school.

Parents who currently have a child attending a Program of Choice and wish their upcoming kindergarten child to enter must still apply and indicate "Confirmation of Sibling Status applies".

CLOSURE OF SCHOOLS FOR EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS



In the case of extreme weather conditions such as ice, wind and/or excessive snowfall, the Superintendent of Schools has authority on behalf of the Board, to temporarily close a school. As a general expectation, parents should assume that schools are open. If parents believe the local conditions are unsafe, they should keep their child at home or arrange his/her early dismissal.

If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations CKNW (980), CKWX (1130) and CBC (690) by 7:30 am if possible
