New Business:

Scott reporting back regarding the Insurance package program Ivano brought up last meeting. How it works is that you sign up for membership which gives you access to insurance services at a discount rate. Checked online and couldn't find anything negative about the program, which means it is either good or very new. The underwriter is Lloyd's of London which is reputable. Scott received a quote on home insurance which was about 12% lower. Do not need membership just to get a quote. If you go forward, you become a member for \$20 - then \$5 would come back to your PAC. Decided not to proceed with this program due to liability concerns and the return is minimal.

Janet is proposing a fall parent dance. She is considering some time in October, again as a welcome to new families and to kick off the new school year. She would like establish a committee to start the planning process. This could be used as a fundraiser for the new playground. Discussed various music options and would like to approach Dave Cadwalader (Caddy's Mobile Music) to hire him for this event.

Craig mentioned that last year Mrs Goodie's room was extremely hot for both students and the teacher and was wondering whether the PAC may be able to help by providing a portable air conditioner. Several issues to consider are: although Mrs. Goodie's room is the only one facing directly south, other classrooms are warm – is it fair to provide for only one? It is important the unit is not noisy. Craig will look around at the prices and models and come back to the next meeting. At the next meeting there will be a motion to spend up to \$600 on a portable air

conditioner for Mrs Goodie's classroom.
