As we head into our Family Day long weekend, we want to wish all of a families a sunny and relaxing few days. Next week presents a very unique situation that sees Tuesday as a non-instructional day and Wednesday and Thursday as early dismissal days. Families are reminded to please make arrangements for children to be picked up or coming home at 1:55pm. Our staff will be engaged in student-led conferences and will not be able to supervise children.

There is a safety theme for this newsletter. Please see the following below:

Checking in at the office

I addressed some concerns at the recent PAC meeting regarding adults being in the building. We are appreciative and thankful for the number of parents we have to make our school a more vibrant place each day. Where we need your help is during school hours. We are asking parents that are coming into the building for extended periods of time to please sign-in in the office. Dropping off a lunch, some HW or a clothing item is only a simple greeting to Ms. Batac or myself in the office. The morning delivery of students to their classes and the 2:45-2:55 pick-up time are not our concerns. We are working with our Montessori program to direct their families around the building to the appropriate entrance.

Dropping Off Students

In recent weeks, we are seeing a growing challenge with our morning traffic that has families dropping children off at the main entrance. We do not have a drop off area and the congestion and safety concerns this causes at our cross walk is very dangerous. Please pull over on Joyce near the sports field or in the cul-de-sac for your children to exit your vehicles..

Lockdown

We will be practicing an emergency lockdown drill in the coming weeks. A lockdown can be initiated by the RCMP or school administrator when there is an immediate and imminent threat to the school. Everyone in the building is secured in locked rooms and no one is allowed to leave until the situation has been safely resolved or everyone is evacuated safely. During lockdown we are aiming to be unseen and unheard.

A Hold and Secure is commonly used when an incident is occurring outside the school building, on or off school property, and there is no immediate or active threat. During a Hold and Secure, the school continues with normal activities but forbids outside activity and unnecessary room-to-room transit. Exterior doors are locked and only authorized personnel may enter. We hope we never have to experience a Hold and Secure or Lockdown situation. However, it is important that we know what to do in case of an emergency. The staff have all practiced these procedures without students present.

*This is for your information. Please use your discretion in sharing with your children. We do not want to cause concern or panic – but we do want to be prepared. The teachers will explain to the children that we are practicing, like we do for fire and earthquake drills.




FREE READY, SET, LEARN EVENT FOR FAMILIES
