* The District will be gathering both quantitative and qualitative data. Quantitative data will focus on comparing data from SD 43 to data from other Metro Districts. Qualitative data will be gathered through focus group discussions from various stakeholder groups, including parents. The District' timeline is to gather information in both quantitative and qualitative areas by the end of the first week of March with a view to completing the study/inquiry by April 1.

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
