



This clinic is for intake to Child and Youth Mental Health services and does not apply to youth/families already accessing Child and Youth Mental Health services.



The four days of activities will run from 9:00 a.m. - 2:45 p.m. each day.

This unique opportunity is part of a wonderful community partnership between Simon Fraser University and School District 43. During the four days of our "School of Wonderstanding," students will participate in a number of different activities such as cooking, crafts, indoor/outdoor games, dance, sports, science experiments, drama and of course, FUN.
