Intellectual Development

Goal: To develop stronger Number Sense in our students.

Rationale:

Continuation of intellectual goal for the past three years. Number sense is a foundational part of the K-5 numeracy curriculum and the skills developed in strong number sense are connected as students progress from K to Gr. 5.

Planned Actions:

Time at our October staff meeting and January focus day reviewing materials and numeracy tasks. Implemention of district numercy tasks from 12/13 classroom teachers. Collaboration time created for teachers to meet and debrief with district numeracy support teachers. Investment of manipulatives to support these numeracy tasks.

Indicators of Success:

FSA Results - 69% of grade 4's on track or extending.

Anecdotal evidence from teachers.

"I am more intentional about using manipulative and grade level skill sets"

"Lots of proficient learners - Stated by 4 teachers - "major gain since last year"



Human and Social Development

Area of focus:

Continuing to address the heightened level of anxiety among our students and easing emotions for students.

Planned Actions:

Continuation of EASE program in our school. Sharing of EASE info and at home lessons with our parent community. EASE training for teaching staff. Parent info sessions at PAC meetings and Connecting to K event. Use of calming spaces in our building: "Cozy den, sensory path, self-regulation room, outdoor courtyard. School wide WITS program. Dedicated time at September PRO D to re-train staff on EASE program.

Indicators of Success:

Feedback shared by staff and by our school counsellor. Staff are seeing increased use of WITS language by students, and students are more vocally stating their emotions and why they are upset.

Area of focus:

Embedding the First Peoples' Principles of Learning into the curriclum.

Planned Actions:

Learning commons teacher and Music teacher using First Peoples' stories, activites, music and drumming wiht all classes. Classroom teachers intentional about adopting First Peoples Principles of Learning iont classroom curriculum. Assembly for Truth & Reconciliation Day, Indigenous Focus Day staff discussion and action plan. Consistent acknowledgement of the territories, talking cirles in classrooms, implementation of the seven teachings, story telling. Planned celebrations next year to recognize the seasons.

Indicators of Success:

Students are more aware of the First Peoples Principles of Learning. Students understand meaning of territorial acknowledgement. Students excited about story telling and music/learning commons activities.

Our social emotion focus of the EASE program continues with classroom lessons and parent information sessions. We have a renewed energy towards this coninued goal with the dedication of EASE training and re-training of staff in September 2025. Our common school wide "WITS" language has also helped students deal with their emotions.

We continue to find ways of embedding the First Peoples Principles of Learning into the curriculum, wiht drumming activities, art, classroom talking circles, acknowledgment of the territories and implemention of the "Seven Teachings" resource. Our staff discussions at the Indigenous Focus day have provided us with renewed focus in the this area moving forward, with concrete plans to celebrate the different seasons in 2025-2026 with different indigenous activities.
