Mrs. Husband's for Your Consideration- Reflecting on who we are.



Montgomery has a strong history of restorative practises (RP) as one of the core beliefs that drives how we interact with each other. An important step in righting a wrong involves students meeting together with an adult facilitator and owning their mistake and setting it right. RP does not mean that consequences are not part of the learning process.

An often less known and understood component of restorative practise is student agency. It is the belief or value that students should have an authentic voice in shaping their school community and be able to impact real change. The class charters, which all classes completed in the fall was one example of student voice. Charters represent students' collective commitment to themselves and each other by describing how they want to their classroom/ school to function.

Each advisory class is represented by one of their classmates on the Montgomery Student Government, which is sponsored by me, Mrs. Husband, and Mr. Heinrichs. Student leaders envisioned how they will work together and the type of issues that they would like to collect student input on, to make improvements at Monty. So far this year, Student Government has expanded the hours of the library, made plans to improve the change rooms, promoted and helped to organize the Winter Market and raised money for Share Food bank through the selling of Candy Cane Grams and more.

In June 2023, we began a school revisioning process with the help of Katrina Thorsen, an experienced facilitator and artist. Katrina met with two groups of students, 22 grades 6/7 and 22 grade 8 students to collect their input about the strengths and needs of our school and to explore a new mission statement, school mascot (a hammer head shark), school name (Monty Mariners), team names (Colours) and our school logo. The name Montgomery Mariners was created during the change from a Jr. Secondary to Middle level in the late 1990's. Prior to that we were the Monty Trojans.

Throughout the year Katrina Thorsen has been working with the Monty staff during a full day Professional Day and team and EA meetings to collect their input. Our student government (some of whom were part of the focus groups in June 2023) have had a role in communicating this information to their class/ team. While we are reflecting on our school mission statement and identity, we are NOT changing our school's name, École Montgomery Middle. We expect this process to take most of the school year and look forward to sharing the outcome with our parent community.

REPORT CARD

Report Cards -Now Available

On December 14th report cards and updated IEPs became available online. If you have not done so, please take time with your child to read through the report card. There is a lot of writing in each report. The areas that are specific to your child are,

- 1. Student perspective
- 2. Teacher comments
- 3. Collaborative Goals and Next Steps

Teachers complete reports cards in MyEd which is the provincial student information system. Using this system ensures that student data is securely stored and creates a record in a system that is used by most districts throughout B.C. All courses are embedded into the report card and are assessed using a proficiency scale and comment rather than a letter grade. Effective September 2023 all reporting for K-9 in B.C. uses a proficiency scale.

Multicultural Lunch

We are planning our Annual **Multicultural Lunch** on **Friday, February 9th, 2024**. This event has been a highlight for many students and was on hold due to COVID in 2021 and 2022. Last year students ate in their classrooms rather than as a school in the gym.

For the Multicultural lunch students bring food to share from their heritage or families donate money (\$10 is recommended) and we purchase food from many cultures (Italian, Indian, Chinese and Japanese). Parent volunteers organize and serve the food at one of 4 food stations. Students will eat either in the gym or in their classroom depending on student and staff rates of illness. Please help us make this meal a community builder.

To reduce our environmental impact, all students need to bring:

- Reusable utensils, plate or bowl and cup
- A bag to carry the clean and dirty dishes to and from home

We will need nearly 40 parent volunteers to make this event possible. A form will be sent out next week with more detailed information. This is a very fun event and is a great opportunity to connect as a community and celebrate multiculturalism at Montgomery.





DISTRICT NEWS

Winter Weather and School Closures

Schools are not usually closed because of snow or other weather conditions. All schools in the Coquitlam School District will remain open, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Our schools are in very different climate zones from one another and there may be the need for **some** schools to be closed within SD43 while others remain open. If there is a partial closure of schools within the school district, these individual schools will be named. Full or partial school closures do not happen often.



Extreme weather can also change the transit bussing. Bus schedules may have changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents looking for information on public bus schedules need to consult the Translink website: http://www.translink.ca/

Early and Late French Immersion for September 2024

Apply on the main page of SD43 website, between January 11, 2024 at 9:00am to January 17, 2024 at 4:00pm.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Siblings will be given priority if the older sibling is in the program of choice in September 2024.
- Applications will be processed on a RANDOM DRAW BASIS.

Early and Late Montessori for September 2024

Apply on the main page of our website between January 11, 2024 at 9:00am to January 17, 2024 at 4:00pm.

Students currently in Grade 5 Montessori and interested in continuing must still apply online and will be given priority over new applications.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Applications will be processed on a RANDOM DRAW BASIS.

CROSS CATCHMENT PROCESS

Parents sometimes wish for their children to attend a school that is not their catchment school. In such cases, a Cross Catchment Application is required after registering at their catchment school. School District 43 uses a random draw process for Cross Catchment Applications (using in-district priority, then out-of-district).

If enrolment projections show that space is available, Cross Catchment transfer Applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities:

- (i) sibling of a child who will be in attendance at the Cross Catchment school in the following year;
- (ii) a child residing within the SD43 residential boundaries (could include private or homeschool) and
- (iii) non-school district resident child.

The **School Locator** tool on the district web site provides a student's designated catchment area schools. **Catchment is based on permanent home address that is currently on record with the school.**

There are two separate applications:

- 1) Kindergarten Cross Catchment- Kindergarten students must first register with their catchment school.
- 2) Grades 1-12 Cross Catchment (including a section to confirm sibling status)

To apply for Cross Catchment:

Apply on the main page of the SD43 website, starting Friday, Feb. 9, 2024 at 9 a.m. to Wednesday, Feb. 14, 2024 at 4 p.m.

- Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a RANDOM DRAW PROCESS.
 (using in-district priority then out-of-district)
- The application requires student number or Personal Education Number (PEN) (can be obtained from your child's school), child's birth date, home address, name of current or assigned school, and the name of the requested school(s). Kindergarten requests do not need to provide the student number/ PEN number.
- Families will be notified by district email of the outcome in the second week of March.

GRADE 10 COAST PROGRAM @ GLENEAGLE SECONDARY

COAST is a life-changing, outdoor education experience for Grade 10 students in semester two. The program integrates academics, leadership, and outdoor trips with an emphasis on character development, where students develop skills in resilience, perseverance, collaboration, self-confidence, and humility. As a result, COAST students gain appreciation and respect for nature. Upon leaving the program, students can expect to have learned the value of making informed and responsible decisions, initiating action, and taking personal responsibility for who they become.

Application Procedure:

Current Grade 9 Gleneagle students are applying for the COAST 2025 Program in Jan/Feb of 2025.

Current Grade 8 students wishing to apply for COAST 2026 who are out of catchment must apply for a cross boundary for their grade 9 year. They will then be eligible to **apply in their Grade 9 year at Gleneagle**.

Application information will be available to Gleneagle Grade 9 students in January 2024, and all applicants will be interviewed in February 2024.

Suitable candidates will be evaluated by a committee on the following criteria:

- commitment to co-operation and respect for others
- level of motivation and initiative-taking
- interest in the program
- responsibility towards academics
- reasonable time management and organizational skills

Funding:

Equipment and travel expenses are covered by fundraising initiatives and a current course fee of \$950. Students who are selected will be contacted and required to pay a \$250 deposit in February, with the remaining \$700 due in September. The cost of the program covers travel, equipment, certifications, and instruction. Students must provide their own sleeping bag, hiking boots, clothing, and food.
